My mother died on Friday, December 13, 1991. Earlier in that week, my family reached me with news of her decline and I was able to arrive home from Ecuador to be with her in those early morning hours. Her death was not sudden; she had been on the journey since a serious stroke three years earlier.

As my sisters and brothers gathered in

the days that followed, we shared wonderful memories of this remarkable and most loving woman. Of course, while we were preparing for Mom's funeral, everything around us was wrapped in Christmas lights, decorations and cheer. While that may have appeared to make our grief more painful, it did not.

BIRTH AND DEATH

Preparing for celebrating the Birth of Jesus Christ – and the power of the promise of this infant king – opens for the Christian the deepest mystery of God's love. In and through the life, death, and resurrection of the Lord, through the ages and today, we joyfully proclaim: "In death life is changed, not ended".

It is the story of life – each life an immeasurable gift, a unique work of art from the Creator, never meant to end, always destined for eternity. Living in this truth can transform our grief and sadness. Not changing it or making it go away, rather transforming it to accept our human frailty and look beyond it to the Author of life and the promise of life eternal.

Christmas 1991 was a peaceful and sweet time for my family. We remembered with deep love and gratitude as we celebrated the Birth of the Messiah, the font of all Love.

Christmas 2020, well maybe you and I need to do something similar. Painful losses beyond measure have been part of everyone's life as well as the life of our nation and world. The human frailty of our nation has been exposed like never before. Nonetheless, we look to Bethlehem and recall Immanuel – God is with us.

The hope we long for is not only from a vaccine but more so, from reembracing the infinite Love, discovered by the shepherds, sought by the kings, and here for us this day.

The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas Day) December 25, 2020



Fourth Sunday of Advent - December 19/20, 2020

In today's Gospel reading we have the story of the Annunciation, when the angel of the Lord announced to Mary that she would give birth to Christ through the intercession of the Holy Spirit. Mary allowed God's messenger to speak to her. She was attentive, not afraid to enter into a dialogue, then unconditionally obedient. Mary's acceptance of this mystery is a stewardship model for us. Good stewards remain open to the incursions of divine life into the normal course of their daily lives. How open are we to the promptings of the Holy Spirit in our own lives? What might we do this last week of Advent to be more attentive to the Lord?



«Vas a dar a luz un hijo, a quien pondrás por nombre Jesús»

Hoy, el Evangelio tiene el tono de un cuento popular. Las rondallas empiezan así: «Había una vez...», se presentan los personajes, la época, el lugar y el tema. Ésta llegará al punto álgido con el nudo de la narración; finalmente, hay el desenlace.

San Lucas, de modo semejante, nos cuenta, con tono popular y asequible, la historia más grande. Presenta, no una narración creada por la imaginación, sino una realidad tejida por el mismo Dios con colaboración humana. El punto álgido es: «Vas a dar a luz un hijo, a

quien pondrás por nombre Jesús» (Lc 1,31).

Este mensaje nos dice que la Navidad está ya cercana. María nos abrirá la puerta con su colaboración en la obra de Dios. La humilde doncella de Nazaret escucha sorprendida el anuncio del Ángel. Precisamente rogaba que Dios enviara pronto al Ungido, para salvar el mundo. Poco se imaginaba, en su modesto entendimiento, que Dios la escogía justamente a Ella para realizar sus planes.

María vive unos momentos tensos, dramáticos, en su corazón: era y quería permanecer virgen; Dios ahora le propone una maternidad. María no lo entiende: «¿Cómo se hará eso?» (Lc 1,34), pregunta. El Ángel le dice que virginidad y maternidad no se contradicen, sino que, por la fuerza del Espíritu Santo, se integran perfectamente. No es que Ella ahora lo entienda mejor. Pero ya le es suficiente, pues el prodigio será obra de Dios: «A Dios nada le es imposible» (Lc 1,38). Por eso responde: «Que se cumplan en mi tus palabras» (Lc 1,38). ¡Que se cumplan! ¡Que se haga! Fiat! Sí. Total aceptación de la Voluntad de Dios, medio a tientas, pero sin condiciones.

En aquel mismo instante, «la Palabra se hizo Carne y habitó entre nosotros» (Jn 1,14). Aquel cuento popular deviene a un mismo tiempo la realidad más divina y más humana. Pablo VI escribió el año 1974: «En María vemos la respuesta que Dios da al misterio del hombre; y la pregunta que el hombre hace sobre Dios y la propia vida».
