Most of my adult life has been blessed with the opportunity to work with young adults, first in colleges and later in the years after graduation. I always enjoy the humor, intelligence, honesty and searching of this age.

Here in Charlestown, we have whole new generations of young men and women, single, engaged and married. Inevitably well-educated and hard-working, the young are seeking to find fulfillment in life. Career choices, friendships, relationships and social life are all a part of the search. For some volunteering is important, and for all some kind of service is respected.

Though perhaps not true of all, I seem to find in many an underlying restlessness among young men and women. No matter how much work, how successful and promising the career path, how well remunerated the job, how brilliant and exciting the social life and how special the relationships with others, there seems to be a pervasive feeling that something's missing – that there must be something more they are meant to achieve, secure or experience. So the restlessness is met with a choice to do more, accomplish more, acquire more, and see more. The resulting "busyness syndrome" does little other than increase the perceived deficit because it cannot be resolved by more of the same.

As if to exacerbate the sense of incompleteness, from time to time a young adult will meet another who seems to possess an inner happiness, completeness and goodness that is untethered from typical achievements. A person for whom personal accomplishments are of less importance than working for and within some ideal - one for whom the "other" takes precedence over "self". Unfortunately our present day culture rewards more what David Brooks calls our "résumé virtues" versus our "eulogy virtues" (New York Times: 4/11/15).



## Fourth Sunday of Lent - March 13/14, 2021

This weekend's Gospel reading gives us the encounter between Jesus and Nicodemus, a Pharisee and leader of the Jews who comes to Jesus by night, recognizing Jesus as a teacher from God, but coming in secret for fear of being put out of the synagogue. Jesus rebukes him for his lack of understanding. Good stewards realize that for the sake of this world, God gives his most cherished beloved son. And so they are willing to confess Jesus as their Lord and savior in a public way. They do not keep their faith to themselves, in darkness. The Gospel reading challenges us to profess our faith in word and deed publicly, not to hide it away. Are we willing to accept the Gospel's challenge? Are we willing to get out of our personal "comfort zone" and confess our faith in Christ Jesus in an open, tangible way?



### " Tanto amó Dios al mundo que entregó a su Hijo único "

Se in-miscuye en nuestra vida, entra para animarla con su gracia y salvarla.

Estamos llamados a abrir los oídos a este anuncio, rechazando la tentación de considerarnos seguros de nosotros mismos, de querer prescindir de Dios, reivindicando para nosotros la absoluta libertad de él y de su palabra. Cuando encontramos el coraje de reconocer lo que realmente somos i se necesita mucho coraje para esto!-, nos damos cuenta de que somos personas llamadas a arreglar las cuentas con nuestra fragilidad y nuestros límites. Y nosotros tenemos la verdadera y grande esperanza en Dios Padre, rico en misericordia, que nos ha dado a su Hijo para salvarnos, y esa es nuestra alegría.

Es verdad que también tenemos muchas tristezas, pero, cuando somos cristianos de verdad, está en nosotros la esperanza, esa pequeña alegría que va creciendo y te da seguridad. No debemos desanimarnos cuando vemos nuestras limitaciones, nuestros pecados, nuestras debilidades: Dios está ahí a tu lado, Jesús está en la cruz para curarte. Esto es el amor de Dios. Hemos de mirar al Crucificado y decimos interiormente: «Dios me ama», Es verdad que tenemos limitaciones, debilidades y pecados, pero él es más grande que todas las limitaciones, pecados y debilidades

Blessed are those who see God in every person,


And strive to make others also discover Him.

### March 19 – Feast of St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary

Everything we know about the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus comes from Scripture. We know he was a carpenter and obedient to God. When he discovered Mary was pregnant after they had been betrothed, he knew the child was not his but did not know that she was carrying the Son of God until an angel came to him in a dream and told him that she had conceived by

the Holy Spirit. He then took Mary as his wife as the angel told him. He wasn't rich for when he took Jesus to the Temple to be circumcised and Mary to be purified he offered the sacrifice of two turtledoves/pair of pigeons, allowed only for those who could not afford a lamb. When the angel came again to tell him that his family was in danger, he immediately left everything he knew and fled to a strange country with his young wife and the baby only to return when the angel told him it was safe. When Jesus was missing he searched with Mary and they found Jesus in the temple. Scripture reveals a devoted, protective spouse and foster father.



### St. Patrick of Ireland

is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. There he found

some sailors who took him back to Britain and was reunited with his family.

A few years after returning home, Patrick saw a vision. The vision prompted his studies for the priesthood. He was ordained by St. Germanus, the Bishop of Auxerre, whom he had studied under for years, and was later ordained a bishop and sent to take the Gospel to Ireland.

Patrick arrived in Slane, Ireland on March 25, 433. There are several legends about what happened next, with the most prominent claiming he met the chieftan of one of the druid tribes, who tried to kill him. After an intervention from God, Patrick was able to convert the chieftain and preach the Gospel throughout Ireland. There, he converted many people -eventually thousands - and he began building churches across the country.

He often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message. Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years. He worked many miracles and wrote of his love for God in Confessions. He died March 17, 461.

## ST ANTHONY SHRINE The Church of Arch Street

On Monday, March 29, we will be hearing confessions by appointment only, from 6am to 6pm.

To make an appointment for this day, please call 617-778-1329, Monday through Friday, from 10am to 4pm. We will ask you for your first name. You may use a pseudonym, but you will need to provide that name at your appointment time. Appointments are for a particular time, not with a particular priest. If you would like to receive this sacrament in a language other than English, please make that known before scheduling the time. On Monday, March 29, we will have priests who can collectively can speak Spanish, French, Italian, Haitian Creole, Korean and Japanese.

Please do not leave a message saying you want an appointment. All appointments must be through a live call. We will accept calls through Friday, March 26, or until we announce that we are fully booked, whichever comes first. If there is sufficient demand, we will add an additional day of confession by appointment.

### Travel to the Church:

On the day of your appointment, if you are not feeling well or you have had recent exposure to someone with Covid, please stay home. We will reschedule your appointment for another time. Please arrive for your appointment within 15 minutes of your appointment time, plus or minus. Arrive with a mask on, and plan to leave it on throughout your visit to the Shrine, including during your confession.

### What to expect when you arrive at the Shrine on Monday,

#### March 29:

Only people with an appointment will be admitted to the building. Please arrive ready to go to confession. You will be directed to a particular, confidential secure place where we will follow Covid protocols. Hand sanitizers and restrooms will be available throughout the day. We are not using the confessionals in the first floor church on this day.

Unfortunately, we are not opening up the usual spaces for prayer and reflection. The churches, private places and statues will not be accessible for private prayer. After you meet with the priest, we will ask you to depart the building. This requires you to do your assigned penance after leaving the Shrine.

### The Friars' Private Liturgical Schedule during Holy Week.

We are livestreaming these events which are not open to the public. Except for confessions by appointment, the Shrine will remain closed throughout Holy Week and Easter Sunday. No general reopening date has been announced.



**Amoris Laetitia Family**  
 Year 2021 - 2022

On March 19, 2021, the Church celebrates the fifth anniversary of the publication of Pope Francis's apostolic exhortation Amoris Laetitia, on the beauty and joy of love in the family. On this same day, Pope Francis will launch the year "Amoris Laetitia Family," which will conclude on June 26, 2022, during the X Meeting of Families in Rome with the Holy Father.

Pope Francis announced the year of "Amoris Laetitia Family during his Angelus Message on the Feast of the Holy Family on December 27, 2020. He ended his address invoking the Blessed Mother, "May the Virgin Mary grant that families throughout the world be increasingly fascinated by the evangelical ideal of the Holy Family, so as to become a leaven of [a] new humanity and of a genuine and universal solidarity."
