Last year at this time, we looked forward to this year imagining that the pandemic would be over and life would return to some semblance of normalcy. However, we are all, once again, entering into the fall with sketchy plans and wondering how this is all going to play out. Educators are feverishly working to put in place good experiences for their students.

Parents are searching to find solutions for too many problems, whether working remotely or dealing with the uncertainty of their children's safety in returning to classroom learning. Everyone is anxious about masks, vaccinations, the delta variant and its spread in the weeks ahead. Yes, this continues to be a stressful and unpredictable autumn.

Is there a place to go to find relief? Is there a formula that makes dealing with all of the ambiguities and challenges possible? I think there is. It begins with an examination of our expectations: why what we think is important really is important. It continues with carefully reviewing what truly matters the most and why it does.

This process means locating our lives and that of our families and friends, in a bigger picture that moves outside of the box of our usual customs and familiarities and perhaps our comfort zones. For example, this morning a young dad, in responding to my question about how his family is doing, replied a lot was very uncertain and worrisome. However, he had a job and so they are blessed. The young mother and father then explained how grateful they are that their three beautiful children are healthy and happy and that the Sunday morning is beautiful.

I believe that one of the most potent resources we have to respond to this terribly hard time is gratitude. That may seem a paradox and I guess it sort of is one. Nonetheless, gratitude flows from a wisdom that recognizes that God is active and present constantly and is always close at hand. "Count your Blessings" is not a simplistic piece of advice from of old. It is an enduring piece of wisdom.

Often, to be implemented, it requires placing our moments in a context bigger



CURAR LA SORDERA

La curación de un sordomudo en la región pagana de Sidón está narrada por Marcos con una intención claramente pedagógica. Es un enfermo muy especial. Ni oye ni habla. Vive encerrado en sí mismo, sin comunicarse con nadie. No se entera de que Jesús está pasando cerca de él. Son otros los que lo llevan hasta el Profeta.


También la actuación de Jesús es especial. No impone sus manos sobre él como le han pedido, sino que lo toma aparte y lo lleva a un lugar retirado de la gente. Allí trabaja intensamente, primero sus oídos y luego su lengua. Quiere que el enfermo sienta su contacto curador. Solo un encuentro profundo con

Jesús podrá curarlo de una sordera tan tenaz. Al parecer, no es suficiente todo aquel esfuerzo. La sordera se resiste. Entonces Jesús acude al Padre, fuente de toda salvación: mirando al cielo, suspira y grita al enfermo una sola palabra: "Effetá", es decir, "Abrete". Esta es la única palabra que pronuncia Jesús en todo el relato. No está dirigida a los oídos del sordo sino a su corazón.

Sin duda, Marcos quiere que esta palabra de Jesús resuene con fuerza en las comunidades cristianas que leerán su relato. Conoce bien lo fácil que es vivir sordos a la Palabra de Dios. También hoy hay cristianos que no se abren a la Buena Noticia de Jesús ni hablan a nadie de su fe. Comunidades sordomudas que escuchan poco el Evangelio y lo comunican mal. Tal vez uno de los pecados más graves de los cristianos de hoy es esta sordera. No nos detenemos a escuchar el Evangelio de Jesús. No vivimos con el corazón abierto para acoger sus palabras. Por eso, no sabemos escuchar con paciencia y compasión a tantos que sufren sin recibir apenas el cariño ni la atención de nadie.

A veces se diría que la Iglesia, nacida de Jesús para anunciar su Buena Noticia, va haciendo su propio camino, olvidada con frecuencia de la vida concreta de preocupaciones, miedos, trabajos y esperanzas de la gente. Si no escuchamos bien las llamadas de Jesús, no pondremos palabras de esperanza en la vida de los que sufren.

Hay algo paradójico en algunos discursos de la Iglesia. Se dicen grandes verdades, pero no tocan el corazón de las personas. Algo de esto está sucediendo en estos tiempos de crisis. La sociedad no está esperando "doctrina social" de los especialistas, pero escucha con atención una palabra clarividente, inspirada en el Evangelio de Jesús cuando es pronunciada por una Iglesia sensible al sufrimiento de las víctimas, y que sabe salir instintivamente en su defensa invitando a todos a estar cerca de quienes más ayuda necesitan para vivir con dignidad.




Blessings and prayers to all of the young men and women and children as well as their families as the return to a new school year gets underway.

**September is the month of the
SEVEN SORROWS (DOLORS) OF MARY**

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard devotion in the Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary's Seven Sorrows would bring great signal graces. The devotion consists in praying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary. Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave his life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of his passion as only a mother can. This devotion is especially remembered during September, the Month of Our Lady of Sorrows (the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is September 15th), and during the season of Lent.

Harvest on Vine postpones cook-out on September 12th due to COVID

St. Mary St. Catherine of Siena, Harvest on Vine emergency food pantry, has indefinitely postponed the September 12th cookout-fundraiser because of the uptick in COVID. We do not want to put anyone at risk.

Harvest on Vine hasn't missed a single distribution since COVID hit, and it hit the poor extra hard. The demand for food, and the number of Charlestown families that need food has increased. The price of food has also increased. Thanks to your generosity, we've been able to meet the demand.

A statewide survey conducted by the Greater Boston Food Bank (GBFB) showed that food insecurity in Massachusetts grew 55% during the pandemic. (See "Gaps in Food Access During the COVID-19 Pandemic in Massachusetts") In response to this gap, Harvest on Vine doubled the amount of food we distribute. Because of the Pandemic, families are now able to receive food twice a month. (Pre-pandemic, our families came once a month.) The amount of fresh produce and fresh milk we supply has tripled.

According to the GBFB study, a major barrier to families getting the food they need is the stigma associated with poverty. We are aware of this stigma, and we continually address it. Our volunteers do an outstanding job welcoming our clients. They treat each person with dignity and respect. This openhearted atmosphere makes it easy for clients to check in. We have never turned anyone away.

The Charlestown community has been charitable to Harvest on Vine, and because of your largesse, we have the means to put forth a first-class operation. The families we serve receive a week's worth of food, twice a month. If you would like to support the efforts of Harvest on Vine, we would be most grateful.


