fought apart from soldiers on the ground, in the air, at sea, and under the sea.

Men and women who put themselves in harm's way to defend a way of life, threatened by outside forces have always been the warriors who we call veterans when they come home. And all too often, some returned damaged, disabled, bruised, and broken. Others returned to be buried by grieving loved ones.

TRIGÉSIMO SEGUNDO DOMINGO del Tiempo Ordinario

He aquí unas citas sobre la caridad de Maimónides, ese judío nacido en Córdoba . uno de los más grandes sabios de la literatura hebrea. “Debemos observar las leyes de la caridad con más cuidado que incluso todos los demás mandamientos”. “Nunca hemos visto ni oído que una comunidad judía no cuente con una fundación para la caridad”. “Nunca nadie se ha hecho pobre haciendo caridad. Ningún daño, ningún mal puede producir la caridad”.

Érase una vez un cerdo y una gallina que iban de paseo por una de las calles del pueblo. Cuando llegaron a la altura de la iglesia leyeron el cartel que anunciaba para el siguiente domingo un rastrillo y un desayuno. En el desayuno se servirían huevos y jamón. La gallina se dirigió al cerdo y le dijo: “Como ves también nosotros vamos a contribuir a las finanzas y a la caridad de la iglesia”. “Sí”, dijo el cerdo, “pero lo tuyo es sólo una pequeña contribución, lo mío es un sacrificio total”

El evangelio que hemos procamado hoy es el evangelio del sacrificio total. Jesús para dar a sus discípulos una enseñanza a sus discípulos, hoy nosotros somos sus discípulos, no acude a Maimónides ni a ningún sabio de su tiempo, a una sabiduría enlatada. Una escena de la vida cotidiana, televisión en directo, le sirve para enseñarnos cómo tiene que ser nuestra relación con Dios y con el prójimo necesitado. Estando Jesús sentado frente al arca de las ofrendas observaba cómo la gente iba echando dinero en el cestillo de las ofrendas.

A ustedes y a mí nos impresionan todos los símbolos de riqueza: los grandes palacios, los coches de alta gama, las celebridades y sus gastos millonarios , la lista de Forbes... A los apóstoles, turistas en Jerusalén, les impresionó la magnificencia del Templo y el ruido de las monedas que echaban en las alcancías. Los hombres que sólo vemos lo de afuera de las cosas y de las personas nos dejamos seducir por las apariencias: rico-pobre, sabio-ignorante, viejo-joven, guapo-feo...Ese es nuestro pecado. ¿Este domingo que impresionó a Jesús? Una viuda pobre y sin nombre y le impresionó tanto que no sólo la alabó sino que la puso como ejemplo para todos sus discípulos.

La viuda no hizo una pequeña contribución sino un sacrificio total. La viuda no dio el 10%, el diezmo, dio el 100%. Vacío sus bolsillos. Dios ve lo que damos y también ve lo que se queda en los bolsillos. Yo creo que la viuda, y todas las viudas que hoy llenan nuestros templos, ofreció su sacrificio total no al Templo sino a Dios. Dios era su Todo. Ustedes y yo somos más prudentes, más calculadores y más conservadores en las cosas del dinero, confiamos poco o nada en la divina providencia, y hasta con el tiempo que damos a Dios y a sus cosas somos tacaños. Dios no es nuestro Todo.

La enseñanza y la alabanza de Jesús a la viuda es sólo una dimensión de este evangelio. La viuda es el contrapunto de los sacerdotes, escribas y burócratas del Templo, ese Leviatán que el ingenuo Jesús quiso purificar con un pequeño látigo. Templo, cueva de ladrones, que Jesús maldice y profetiza su ruina total.

El Templo era una abominación, todos los templos lo son, cuando se convierten en fin, se divinizan y hacen superfluo a Dios. El Templo en lugar de conectar a los fieles con Dios se convierte en un vulgar Banco, en negocio puro y duro, que explota y roba a los pobres.

El sacrificio total de nuestros bienes y de nuestra vida no lo debemos ofrecer a ningún Templo, ya sea el Vaticano o nuestra pequeña iglesia. Sólo Dios nos exige el sacrificio total. Sólo a Dios debemos ofrecerle el don de nuestra vida. Actos de caridad, de amor, secretos y humildes, fáciles de ocultar a los demás, pero difíciles de ocultar a nuestro yo orgulloso y vanidoso. Y como Dios nunca será del todo nuestro Todo, siempre viviremos la tensión de ofrecer como la gallina una pequeña contribución o como la viuda y el cerdo un sacrificio total.



November 7 ~ Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Two readings from today's scriptures focus on stories of widows. Both were poor women in relation to worldly standards and yet when called upon to be generous they gave everything they had. In the gospel, Jesus points out the action of the widow with the words "she contributed all she had. . . ." Being a grateful disciple of Christ requires a spirit of stewardship of the multiple gifts God has bestowed on us. It means being willing, like the two widows, to make sacrifices, to offer prayer and service to the parish as well as to those most in need. Are you willing to share

these gifts? This week, pay attention for opportunities that God will provide for you to share your time, your talent, and your treasure - and then - respond as a grateful disciple!




They need our help.


