sense to realize and accept that this wonderful season of the year brings with it certain stresses and demands. Each of us needs to acknowledge our limits and own the situations of our families and friends. It is OK to give oneself permission to NOT feel there is something wrong if one does not want to sing *Ho – Ho – Ho!*

The consequence for many who experience the pressure of this time of year is to feel painfully alone and maybe disconnected from others. All around one sees people together and apparently happy and celebrating and for some that is not their experience. Acknowledging that it is OK to feel out of step with what the culture says "*ought to be*" often helps. Giving voice to our sadness in conversations with good friends eases one's struggle.

Even more, bringing my pain, sadness, loneliness and struggle to God in prayer offers one the deepest source of comfort. Through prayer, one can come to recognize that one is not alone; that God who promises to be with us always is truly there regardless of how we feel. Then we can begin to remember that we, too, have experienced goodness before and will again. So even in the midst of life's pains and struggles, often we can find reason to give thanks. The celebration of the Birth of Jesus Christ truly is cause for joy – for all people in all times.

This holiday season any one of us can find moments when loneliness seems more painful in the light of the season. When such moments occur, take them as invitations to turn to God in humble prayer and your aloneness will give way to a peace and a sense of the goodness that is inherent in these holiday times.

Thank you Thanksgiving Distribution Update



Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe December 12

On December 9, 1531 a poor Mexican Indian, Juan Diego, was walking by a hill near his village when he heard beautiful music. Suddenly there appeared a radiant cloud and within it a young Indian maiden dressed as an Aztec princess. The young maiden spoke to the 57-year-old widower in his native language and directed him to visit the Archbishop of Mexico with a request that a chapel be built where she stood. The archbishop demanded a sign of authenticity, and the maiden instructed Juan Diego to gather flowers from the top of the hill where they met. Even though December was too late in the growing season for flowers to bloom, Juan Diego was surprised to find Castilian roses, not native to Mexico. On December 12, Juan Diego opened his cloak before the archbishop, the roses fell to the floor, and in their place the image of the young virgin was miraculously imprinted on the fabric. News spread quickly, and shortly thereafter an estimated nine million Indians converted to Catholicism. Our Lady's appearance to a poor, humble man is a compelling reminder that God's loving embrace is all-inclusive; and that our Church's preferential option for the poor is a Gospel imperative.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, mystical rose, make intercession for the Holy Church, protect the Sovereign Pontiff, help all those who invoke thee in their necessities, and since thou art the ever Virgin Mary and Mother of God, obtain for us from thy most holy Son the grace of keeping our faith, sweet hope in the midst of the bitterness of life, burning charity and the precious gift of final perseverance. ¿QUÉ TENEMOS QUE HACER?

Cuentan que dos hermanos abrieron una carnicería en la calle Gascón de Gotor y el negocio les iba muy bien. La clientela estaba satisfecha con el servicio. Un domingo uno de los hermanos fue a la Eucaristía, oró, escuchó la Palabra de Dios y la predicación y decidió convertirse al Señor y cambiar de vida.

Éste le predicaba a su hermano y le invitaba a ir a la iglesia y dar el paso a la fe, pero no conseguía nada. ¿Por qué no quieres cambiar?, le preguntaba a su hermano. Éste le contestó: “Si acepto a Cristo y cambio ¿quién va a pesar la carne? Cambiar, creer en Cristo, es un cambio radical de conducta a nivel personal y profesional. El hermano no quería con-

vertirse para poder seguir haciendo trampas. Comprendía la seriedad de la decisión y el riesgo que corría y las exigencias de la fe. Fe y vida van unidas, separadas no sirven de nada por más ritos religiosos que consumamos.

Una foto que ha dado la vuelta al mundo estos días ha sido la foto del policía de Nueva York arrodillado junto a un vagabundo tirado en una de las calles de la ciudad. Hacía frío y estaba descalzo. El policía se compadeció, fue a una tienda y compró unas botas muy caras y se las dio al vagabundo. Sabía lo que tenía que hacer y seguro que lo habrá hecho otras muchas veces. Decíamos el domingo pasado que “la Palabra de Dios vino sobre Juan, hijo de Zacarías, en el desierto”. Palabra que interrumpió su vida y se dedicó a predicarla. Nadie tiene el monopolio de la Palabra, ni siquiera los curas. Dios y su Palabra pertenecen a todos los que la escuchan y la acogen. Todos llamados a ser predicadores.

Juan se convirtió en el predicador lleno de fuego y de ira, en el profeta bíblico que exigía decisión a favor del Mesías que bautiza con fuego y espíritu. Para llegar a Belén hay que pasar por el control de pasaportes que Juan tiene en el Jordán. Hay que quitarse los zapatos, el cinturón, dejar las llaves y las monedas y permitir que te chequee y te desnude de todas las maldades cometidas contra los hombres, tus hermanos. Como en todos los buenos sermones el predicador predica y los aludidos preguntan. La gente, nos dice el evangelio, preguntó a Juan: ¿Qué tenemos que hacer? Pregunta mágica que, a veces, tranquiliza y otras muchas anestesia.

Juan les dice y nos dice: No les manda dejar sus trabajos y convertirse en ascetas en las cuevas del desierto a imitación suya. No les pide que vayan al Templo de Jerusalén a ofrecer sacrificios y holocaustos. No les pide que hagan novenas y ramilletes espirituales. Las piedadidades de siempre están bien pero sirven de poco. La religión no es un escudo para aplacar y detener la ira de Dios sino una bendición para que cada uno de nosotros seamos bendición para los demás. Juan les dice y nos dice: COMPARTIR. “El que tenga dos túnicas que se las reparta a los que no tienen”.

No basta con dejar de ser malo y no abusar y engañar a los demás. No basta con decir cada uno en su casa y Dios en la de todos. Arrepentirse y cambiar es difícil y tiene un precio. Nosotros acumulamos. Juan nos pide compartir los frutos de nuestro trabajo y los de nuestra fe. Zaqueo, un cobrador de impuestos como aquellos que escuchaban la predicación de Juan, se convirtió escuchando a otro predicador más famoso, a Jesús, y devolvió todo lo que había robado. A los soldados a sueldo de Roma les predica la no-violencia, no abusar de la autoridad de la fuerza, no extorsionar a nadie. Contentaos con la paga. Convertirse, cambiar, dejar sin mirar atrás porque lo que se encuentra es mucho mejor y más gratificante.

Adviento es mirar hacia delante, al futuro, y el futuro es Dios. Recuerden que uno nunca, nunca, se convierte del todo. La vida cristiana es siempre una carretera en obras. El día que dejamos de repararla es que Dios ya no viaja por ella. Abraham Lincoln solía ir a la iglesia presbiteriana todos los miércoles que estaba en Washington D.C. Un miércoles cuando salía de la iglesia uno de sus acompañantes le preguntó: Mr. President, que le ha parecido el sermón? Lincoln contestó: “El contenido fue excelente y Dr. Gurley habló con gran elocuencia. Es obvio que lo ha trabajado mucho”.

Entonces cree que fue un gran sermón, Mr. President? No, no dije eso. Dije que el contenido fue excelente y que el predicador habló con gran elocuencia. Pero Dr. Gurley, esta noche, olvidó algo muy importante. Olvidó pedirnos que hiciéramos algo grande.
