CHOICES



The other day, I was reading one of those emails that friends send because they find it inspiring. Am I the only person who is amazed at the volume of this kind of stuff that is circulating out there? Anyway, I do not always choose to read these types of emails – sometimes a time thing or a mood thing or a need to feel the tiny satisfaction of pressing the delete button. But I read this one.

It was about a man who was always positive – never did he seem to have a bad day or a lousy reaction to circumstances in his life. Now, this always “up” attitude both amazed and bothered others! And finally, one friend approached the man and asked him how he could be so un-bothered by life’s challenging moments.

The explanation given was thoughtful and insightful. The man said he had arrived at a point in his life where he realized that everything is about choice. Though one cannot control everything that happens, one does have a choice as to how to respond. He decided that he would look for the positive in whatever happened and choose to focus on that. He explained that he knew there were a lot of problems and issues in his life and in the world, and he was not ignoring them; rather he was choosing to live through them finding the good that he is certain is within each moment.

It sounds so simple - maybe even naïve! Yet as I ponder the story, I see some similarities in myself. More often than not, I react to a moment without really, consciously, choosing how I wish to respond. My reaction can draw me in a direction that is not positive for others or me. It is that extra moment of conscious awareness to recognize what is happening and deliberately choose how I wish to respond. That, for me, is the element I often by-pass.

One evening, in a conversation with a group of young adults, a discussion arose about the intensity of their fast-paced, time pressured, scripted lives and the tension and stress they felt because they had very limited available time. The same holds true for many parents. Often they speak of the hectic pace of daily life where children have so many activities and commitments that a typical calendar is crammed with appointments and "to-do's", hanging on to the refrigerator door – by a thread.

I wonder why we choose to live with such intensity? Or perhaps we forget that we can make some different choices? The truth is that there will always be more to do. So we need to carve out time for what is essential which takes priority over what is necessary.

There is a beautiful scene from the Old Testament where God tells Moses to go to the people and invite them to make a choice: "Today I set before you, life and death – to whichever you stretch out your hand – you will have". Every new day, even before we put our feet on the floor, we have a choice of how we wish to live that day – in a life-giving way or not. No one else can make that choice for us – it is ours alone to make.

God is very clear on how we should live each day: choosing life – a life that is more in balance. Choose a life in which we can appreciate the gifts with which we have been blessed – family, creation, a deeper relationship with God; a life in which we are not so overwhelmed that we forget to treat others and ourselves with respect, patience, kindness, humor, and love. Indeed, that is precisely how God treats you and me every day – maybe we should make the same choice.



El otro día estaba leyendo uno de esos correos electrónicos que envían los amigos porque les resulta inspirador. ¿Soy la única persona que está asombrada por el volumen de este tipo de cosas que están circulando por ahí? De todos modos, no siempre elijo leer este tipo de correos electrónicos, a veces es una cuestión de tiempo o de estado de ánimo o la necesidad de sentir la pequeña satisfacción de presionar el botón Eliminar. Pero leí este.

Se trataba de un hombre que siempre fue positivo: nunca pareció tener un mal día o una reacción pésima a las circunstancias de su vida. ¡Ahora, esta actitud siempre “arriba” asombró y molestó a otros! Y finalmente, un amigo se acercó al hombre y le preguntó cómo podía estar tan tranquilo con los momentos difíciles de la vida.

La explicación dada fue reflexiva y perspicaz. El hombre dijo que había llegado a un punto de su vida en el que se dio cuenta de que todo se trata de elección. Aunque uno no puede controlar todo lo que sucede, uno tiene la opción de cómo responder. Decidió que buscaría lo positivo en lo que sucediera y optaría por centrarse en eso. Explicó que sabía que había muchos problemas y asuntos en su vida y en el mundo, y que no los estaba ignorando; más bien, estaba eligiendo vivir a través de ellos encontrando el bien que está seguro de que hay en cada momento.

Suena tan simple, ¡tal vez incluso ingenuo! Sin embargo, mientras reflexiono sobre la historia, veo algunas similitudes en mí mismo. La mayoría de las veces, reacciono en un momento sin elegir realmente, conscientemente, cómo deseo responder. Mi reacción puede llevarme en una dirección que no es positiva para los demás ni para mí. Es ese momento extra de conciencia para reconocer lo que está sucediendo y elegir deliberadamente cómo deseo responder. Ese, para mí, es el elemento que a menudo paso por alto.

Una noche, en una conversación con un grupo de adultos jóvenes, surgió una discusión sobre la intensidad de sus vidas aceleradas, presionadas por el tiempo y con guiones, y la tensión y el estrés que sentían porque tenían un tiempo disponible muy limitado. Lo mismo es cierto para muchos padres. A menudo hablan del ritmo frenético de la vida diaria donde los niños tienen tantas actividades y compromisos que un calendario típico está repleto de citas y tareas pendientes, colgando de la puerta del refrigerador, por un hilo.

Me pregunto por qué elegimos vivir con tanta intensidad. ¿O tal vez olvidamos que podemos tomar algunas decisiones diferentes? La verdad es que siempre habrá más que hacer. Así que tenemos que sacar tiempo para lo esencial que tiene prioridad sobre lo necesario.

Hay una hermosa escena del Antiguo Testamento donde Dios le dice a Moisés que vaya al pueblo y lo invite a hacer una elección: “Hoy pongo delante de ti, la vida y la muerte, a quien estires tu mano, tendrás”. Cada nuevo día, incluso antes de que pongamos los pies en el suelo, tenemos la opción de cómo deseamos vivir ese día, de una manera que da vida o no. Nadie más puede tomar esa decisión por nosotros; solo nosotros podemos tomarla.

Dios tiene muy claro cómo debemos vivir cada día: eligiendo la vida, una vida más equilibrada. Elegir una vida en la que podamos apreciar los dones con los que hemos sido bendecidos: familia, creación, una relación más profunda con Dios; una vida en la que no estemos tan abrumados que nos olvidemos de tratar a los demás ya nosotros mismos con respeto, paciencia, amabilidad, humor, y amor. De hecho, así es precisamente como Dios nos trata a usted y a mí todos los días; tal vez deberíamos tomar la misma decisión.

He was sent to jail for performing weddings for couples during a time when new marriages were outlawed in ancient Rome. Emperor Claudius II outlawed marriage while trying to build up his army, fearing it was an obstacle to recruiting men and a distraction to those already in the army.


Before he was killed for refusing to renounce his faith, he sent a loving note to a child he had been helping to teach, the daughter of his jailer, who was blind and whose sight was healed after receiving the letter so that she could read it herself. That note eventually led to the tradition of sending Valentine's cards.


