

How to Love



Expect nothing back,” Jesus says. I don’t know if you have read the book, [Don’t Sweat the Small Stuff \(and it’s all small stuff\)](#) by Richard Carlson. It offers advice and examples as to how we can live a loving and (more) peaceful life.

One chapter shows us a way to be patient rather than upset when someone else does an annoying thing. For instance, if a car swerves in front of you, instead of your asking, “why in the “%\$#” did he do that?” ask the question, “what is he trying to teach

me?” It is like a game in which everyone is wise and you want to learn.

That question changed my perspective a number of times.

When a car went through a very narrow opening behind a truck and careened into my lane with several inches to spare, I tried this method. Instead of leaning on the horn and unpacking some road-rage, I asked what the swerver was teaching me. Honestly, it softened my attitude and gave me some compassion. I am not trying to sell copies of Carlson’s books here, though I surely like this one.* I am pointing out how new attitudes can be helpful, and how the generous writing of Dr. Carlson soothed me into trying one on.

Jesus lived before Dr. Carlson, of course, and he suggested the same big perspective-change. The Lord’s prose is a bit jagged, less consoling. In fact, he seems to be hammering at the crowd. In Sunday’s Gospel he describes us as trying to bargain for everything. If someone loves us, then we agree to love them in return. If they run their car over our flower-bed or nearly knock us out of the crosswalk, then we are angry and substitute bad feelings for love. After all, who could be nice to a robber in the act of robbing you?

Jesus recommends the opposite. “Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you.” Don’t ask for anything in return. Gulp, maybe we should go back to Richard Carlson! How can we love without return? “Lend money and es. If you get a reward for each thing you do, you are just like the pagans. But is it even possible to just love and love and love and never get our own empty tank filled back up? Wouldn’t that be the road

He says that if we can give without guile, then we will be like "children of the Most High," *who is always kind to the ungrateful and the wicked*. How can God be "always kind"? Because his needs are all already filled. His tender love does not need reward, and so it overflows to us no matter what we do.

If we know this, if we experience it—say, in the Sacraments, or in prayer, or in another person—and if we let it in, then maybe our need-tanks will be pre-filled. Maybe our love can start to overflow to others as God's does.

How about that as a change in perspective?



Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time - February 19/20, 2022

In today's Gospel reading Jesus urges his listeners to "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." He also offers several examples of putting mercy into action. Listeners can then reason their way into how to put the values of the Gospel reflected in these imperatives into practice in other situations. Good stewards look for opportunities to exercise God's mercy toward others. They realize that, in doing so, their own experience of God's mercy not only becomes more profound but affirms their hope of seeing the Lord face-to-face

one day. How have we experienced God's mercy in our lives? How might our thinking, attitudes, words and actions reflect God's mercy on someone else today?



ASH WEDNESDAY - Lent Begins March 2, 2022

Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer. Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is chiefly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it too.

Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. Writings from the Second-century Church refer to the wearing of ashes as a sign of penance. Priests administer ashes during Mass and all are invited to accept the ashes as a visible symbol of penance. Small children, the elderly and sick are exempt from this observance.

Tiempo Ordinario (c)
Lc 6, 27-38

Un maestro dijo un día a sus alumnos: mañana van a traer a la escuela una funda de plástico transparente y un saco de patatas. Al día siguiente todos trajeron lo mandado por el maestro. Éste les dijo: por cada persona que te niegues a perdonar elige una patata, escribe el nombre de la persona y la fecha de la ofensa y colócala en la bolsa de plástico. Algunas bolsas eran bien pesadas y estaban bien llenas. Luego les dijo: tienen que llevar la bolsa a todos los sitios que vayan y por la noche la colocan junto a su cama.

La molestia e incomodidad de cargar cada día con la bolsa de patatas con sus nombres y fechas les hizo sentir el peso espiritual que llevaban dentro. La condición de las patatas con el tiempo empeoró y olían a muerto. Este es el precio que pagamos por almacenar rencores y odios. A veces pensamos que el perdón es un regalo que hacemos a los otros; no, es un regalo que nos hacemos a nosotros. El domingo pasado, en el sermón de las bienaventuranzas, Jesús nos hablaba de la felicidad. y decíamos que la felicidad es elegir bien, elegir a Dios, apoyar nuestra debilidad en Dios.

Hoy, hemos proclamado la continuación en Lucas 6: 27-38. "Yo les digo a ustedes que me escuchan: amen a sus enemigos, hagan el bien a los que los odian, bendigan a los que les maldicen, oren por los que los maltratan"... Vaya medicina nos receta el Señor. No vayan a comprarla a la farmacia. Esta es la felicidad sin anestesia y sin éxtasis. "Amen a sus enemigos". ¿Quién es mi enemigo? Jesús nos lo dice: el que me odia, el que me maltrata, el que me maldice, el que no me habla, el que escupe cuando pasa a mi lado...

Hoy, vamos a poner nombre a nuestros enemigos. Los enemigos los tenemos siempre cerca de nosotros. Están con nosotros, tienen nombre y apellidos familiares. No has traído la bolsa de plástico y las patatas para escribir el nombre pero yo sé que es un gran peso llevar en el corazón el peso de los enemigos. ¿Puedo perdonar y amar al padre que me abandonó? ¿Puedo perdonar a ese jefe que me insulta y explota? ¿Puedo perdonar a ese hermano que se quedó con mi herencia? ¿Puedo perdonar? No, nunca. El amor no es un sentimiento dulce, ni un éxtasis.

"Amar a los enemigos, hacer el bien a los que me odian..." no es posible, no está escrito en los genes. Esto sólo está escrito en el Libro de Jesús, esto sólo lo hace Jesús y los que tienen el espíritu de Jesús. Esto sólo se aprende mirando al crucificado. Amar, perdonar, a mi marido, mujer, hijos, hermanos, jefes, vecinos...no es una tarea humana, es una tarea sobrenatural. Dios perdona, ama siempre y las lágrimas de Dios en la cruz son las lágrimas por ti y por mi cuando nos negamos a amar. El amor no es un sentimiento dulce, no es calor ni vibración, no es éxtasis ni fuego loco, ese es siempre el amor imposible. El amor es actuar, es voluntad, es decisión, es elección. Y aunque sentir amor sea imposible, elegir el amor siempre es posible para los que aman a Dios.

El evangelio de Jesús es una llamada a hacer lo extraordinario. "Si aman a los que les aman, ¿qué mérito tienen? Eso lo hace todo el mundo. El evangelio de Jesús nos exige a los que lo escuchamos que seamos diferentes, que vivamos en otra onda, que imitemos al maestro, que hagamos, con su poder, el gesto imposible del amor y del perdón. Jesús no nos promete que nuestro enemigo se va a transformar en nuestro amigo. Y no olvide que usted tiene su lista pero que también está en la lista de alguien. Usted también ha herido a alguien y necesita su perdón. Y todos estamos en la lista de Dios. Y como Dios es fantástico y siempre hace lo extraordinario, hoy ha sido perdonado. Dios siempre perdona, esta es la cara verdadera del evangelio
