The Question is Why?



Now that we are in the second week of Lent, the readings and the liturgies will increasingly focus on the suffering and death of Jesus. Those who are seeking to understand Christianity ask the question from time to time: *"How could one say that if Jesus is God, He would choose to die on the cross?"* The cross is the immovable, the unavoidable center of Christianity. That Jesus chose to go to Jerusalem and willingly submit Himself to unimaginable suffering and death is perplexing.

Saint Paul once wrote, *"The cross is an absurdity for the Gentiles and a stumbling block for the Jews"*. Indeed. And what is the cross for you and me? Maybe it is too simplistic, but given that Jesus is "true God and true man", I think we can reduce it to two possibilities. Either Je-

sus was deranged – somehow out of His mind or it was an act of immeasurable love. I believe it to be the latter.

For love, God the Father sent His only Son into the world and for love; this Jesus walked among us eventually to Jerusalem and suffered the death of a prophet. This love is for you and for me. It is a love that is complex, and a number of years ago, Pope Benedict XVI spoke about it in his Lenten message to the world. He said that this love is both *agape* and *eros*. God's love for us both wishes to serve us and wishes to be in union with us.

This Lenten journey that we are on might be said to be a journey to learn more deeply about love. To wonder about God's love for me, made manifest in countless ways and to wonder about how well I reflect this love in my daily life. For in whatever form, authentic love is always a gift. It is never anything that I can cre-

The Parish Pastoral Council 2022

On Palm Sunday, April 10, 2022 at the 10:30 a.m. Family Mass, we will select names of persons who have been nominated and have accepted nomination to be members of our Parish Pastoral Council. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, four (4) names will be selected by lot. The nomination process begins on the weekend of March 19/20. Only registered parishioners may nominate or be nominated.

Nominees must also participate in the sacramental life of the Church and be 18 years of age or older. PPC members must serve a full term of three (3) years and attend monthly meetings from September to June. As a consultative body, the Parish Pastoral Council is responsible to the pastor, assisting and supporting him in his leadership role. It recognizes the varied gifts of the parish members and invites them to an active leadership role in the parish.

The Council is an important means by which the pastor hears the voice of parishioners. In deliberations and consultation with the pastor, the council helps to unite the pastor and parishioners. Together they discern the pastoral needs of the parish and ways in which those needs can be addressed.

Once the nominations are in, the nominees will be contacted to see if they accept the nomination. If they do, their names will go into a "pot" for selection on Palm Sunday. Regardless of how many times people are nominated, their names are placed into the pot only once.

Please prayerfully consider possible candidates for the Council and submit their names no later than Tuesday, April 4, to give us adequate time to contact the nominees prior to selection on Palm Sunday.

Second Sunday of Lent - March 12/13, 2022

In today's second reading we learn that one of Saint Paul's principles of Christian living is to watch and imitate other followers of Christ. There is a pattern for Christian living that Saint Paul wants others to discover and then imitate. This pattern includes a life of prayer, selflessness, sacrifice, and caring for others, including our family of faith. Good stewards choose their friends wisely. They cultivate friendships with other Christian stewards, spend time with them, observe how they live, ask questions about their faith and learn from them. Who are your friends? Are they good stewards of their faith? Are they those who can help you on your own journey of faith?

Pedro empezó a decir sus tonterías y una nube los envolvió y se asustaron en esta enorme turbulencia. Dios era la turbulencia. Dios era el terremoto. Dios era la presencia y la sorpresa. Y Dios dijo: "Este es mi Hijo. Mi elegido. Escuchadle." Y se despertaron y vieron a Jesús solo. Y guardaron silencio. Y no se lo contaron a nadie. Me decía un niño después de la misa: ¡Cómo gritaba el domingo! Yo no entendía nada de lo que decía, pero miraba a mi papá y él si entendía y parece que le gustaba, pues se reía.

Cuando hablamos de Dios, todos decimos muchas tonterías y, tal vez, Dios también se ría o lllore. Cuando tenemos intimidad con alguien también decimos muchas tonterías porque lo importante no es lo que se dice sino lo que se vive, se goza y se experimenta. Nosotros estamos aquí no para dar una definición de Dios, no para hablar correctamente de Dios, sino para vivir y experimentar a Dios, para tener un encuentro breve pero intenso con Dios en fe y en visión.

March 19 – Feast of St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary



Everything we know about the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus comes from Scripture. We know he was a carpenter and obedient to God. When he discovered Mary was pregnant after they had been betrothed, he knew the child was not his but did not know that she was carrying the Son of God until an angel came to him in a dream and told him that she had conceived by the Holy Spirit. He then took Mary as his wife as the angel told him. He wasn't rich for when he took Jesus to the Temple to be circumcised and Mary to be purified he offered the sacrifice of two turtledoves/pair of pigeons, allowed only for those who could not afford a lamb. When the angel came again to tell him that his family was in danger, he immediately left everything he knew and fled to a strange country with his young wife and the baby only to return when the angel told him it was safe. When Jesus was missing he searched with Mary and they found Jesus in the temple. Scripture reveals a devoted, protective spouse and foster father.

March 17 - St. Patrick of Ireland



is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. There he found some sailors who took him back to Britain and was reunited with his family.

A few years after returning home, Patrick saw a vision. The vision prompted his studies for the priesthood. He was ordained by St. Germanus, the Bishop of Auxerre, whom he had studied under for years, and was later ordained a bishop and sent to take the Gospel to Ireland.

He often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message. Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years. He worked many miracles and wrote of his love for God in Confessions. He died March 17, 461.


