At the moment I am writing, families are gathered with small children on blankets as a troubadour serenades the gathering and the kids sing along. Seasons changing is one of the many blessings of life in New England.

Yet the metaphor of changing seasons extends beyond climate and weather. The

exquisite passage from the Old Testament Book of Ecclesiastes (3:1-8), has been read for thousands of years and appreciated for its wisdom and beauty. There are multiple seasons of our lives and the text eloquently describes them from birth to death, laughter to tears, war to peace, planting to harvesting and so many more. Each of us knows these seasonal changes in our own lives and in all around us our families, our communities, and our world.

I am preparing for a change of seasons, so to speak, in my own life. On June 5, I will retire as pastor in Charlestown after 18 years. Now months after my 77th birthday, I am thinking a lot about seasons changing! Someone asked me after Mass on Sunday how good I was in "letting go". I had to think about how I wished to answer, for I had not thought much about that.

Like every one of us, I have had to let go of many places, jobs, family members, homes, friends, and more over the years. Sometimes these changes are wrenching and other times less so. Leaving Charlestown will be hard to do. There is so much that is wonderful about the people in The Town and about being a parish priest here. Furthermore, returning to Boston after many years away has been a joy – I am a city guy and love this unique neighborhood.

With immeasurable gratitude to God and to so many in our community, I will let go of Charlestown and carry within me the multiple blessings of these years. A new season is ahead and God is good.

Third Sunday of Easter - April 30/ May 1, 2022

This weekend's Gospel reading from John enjoys a number of themes not least of which has to do with hearing Christ's call to live differently but returning to our "comfort zones." Even after seeing the risen Lord and receiving his blessing and missionary charge, his disciples go back to what they were doing before Jesus first called them. Instead of continuing Jesus' ministry, they return to the life they knew. When faced with the choice between embarking on a new way of life or staying where life is familiar and comfortable, they chose the latter. Good stewards know that Christ has called them to open their hearts and live in a different way. How often do we retreat from the Lord's call so that we may remain with what is

UNA TEMPORADA PARA TODO

El cambio de estaciones es una de las muchas bendiciones de la vida en Nueva Inglaterra.

Sin embargo, la metáfora del cambio de estaciones se extiende más allá del clima y el tiempo. El exquisito pasaje del Libro del Antiguo Testamento de Eclesiastés (3:1-8), ha sido leído durante miles de años y apreciado por su sabiduría y belleza. Hay múltiples estaciones de nuestras vidas y el texto las describe con elocuencia desde el nacimiento hasta la muerte, de la risa a las lágrimas, de la guerra a la paz, de la siembra a la cosecha y muchas más. Cada uno de nosotros conoce estos cambios estacionales en nuestras propias vidas y en todo lo que nos rodea: nuestras familias, nuestras comunidades y nuestro mundo.

Me estoy preparando para un cambio de estaciones, por así decirlo, en mi propia vida. El 5 de junio me jubilaré como pastor en Charlestown después de 18 años. Ahora, meses después de mi cumpleaños número 77, iestoy pensando mucho en el cambio de las estaciones! Alguien me preguntó después de la misa del domingo qué tan bueno era en "dejar ir". Tuve que pensar en cómo deseaba responder, porque no había pensado mucho en eso.

Como cada uno de nosotros, he tenido que dejar muchos lugares, trabajos, familiares, hogares, amigos y más a lo largo de los años. A veces estos cambios son desgarradores y otras veces menos. Dejar Charlestown será difícil de hacer. Hay tantas cosas maravillosas en la gente de The Town y en ser párroco aquí. Además, volver a Boston después de muchos años de ausencia ha sido un placer: soy un hombre de ciudad y amo este vecindario único.

Hay, sin embargo, otro aspecto de esta evolución que es constante. Durante cuarenta años, soy un sacerdote católico ordenado y un hombre nunca se retira de la vida y obra más esencial de un sacerdote. Sin embargo, retirarse de ser pastor, ieso es otro asunto!

Las líneas finales del pasaje del Libro del Eclesiastés son profundas para mí y quizás también para ti: "He considerado la tarea que Dios nos ha asignado para que nos ocupemos. Dios ha hecho todo apropiado a su tiempo, y ha puesto lo atemporal en nuestros corazones, sin que jamás descubramos, de principio a fin, la obra que Dios ha hecho".

Con una gratitud inconmensurable a Dios ya tantos en nuestra comunidad, dejaré Charlestown y llevaré dentro de mí las múltiples bendiciones de estos años. Se avecina una nueva temporada y Dios es bueno.

May is the Month of Mary!

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam she is one with all those who are to be saved. (Lumen Gentium, no. 53)

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed." The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf.


