About Us

MEMORIAL DAY

While Memorial Day has its origin as honoring war veterans, many citizens choose the day to remember their deceased loved ones as well. The birthplace of Memorial Day is Waterloo, NY. There on May 5, 1866 local veterans remembered those who served and lost their lives in the Civil War. Shops were closed, flags were flown at halfmast, and flowers were placed on the graves of the deceased veterans.

From that time, and especially in 1888 when a major observance was held at Arlington National Cemetery, until the end of the 19th century, Memorial Day ceremonies were held on May 30 throughout the nation. State legislatures passed proclamations designating the day, and the Army and Navy adopted regulations for proper observance at their facilities.

It was not until after World War I, however, that the day was expanded to honor those who have died in all American wars. In 1971, Memorial Day was declared a national holiday by an act of Congress, though it is still often called Decoration Day. It was then also placed on the last Monday in May.

As a child, one early memory of this important day of remembrance was getting into our old Chevy wagon and going over into Forest Hills, Hyde Park and those neighborhoods where there are several cemeteries. On the way we would stop and purchase flowers, baskets, ivy, and the like. The whole experience was unusual for me as family members explained that a deceased grandparent or other relative was buried here and on this day we place flowers at the graveside to honor and remember. I had never met any of these deceased and so the occasion offered family a chance to tell me something of their story. Looking back over the years, I can see that the simple experience of going to the cemetery and remembering brought into the present the reality of that person's life and often a recollection of the blessings that one brought to our family.

There are so many Americans who have served in the military. And for we served and/or those in the same branches of the service who

served in the same places, bases, ships, planes ... who lost their lives in service. And on this day, everyone is caught up, once again, in the tragedy of war. How many great leaders of nations, religions and armies have made impassioned pleas to end war and not to go to war? And yet our human condition is such that at times we are unable to resolve the intractable issues of world conflicts without going to war.

This Memorial Day, as is at times the case, falls in the Easter Season. The centrality of the *empty tomb* and belief in the resurrection of Jesus from the dead frees us to see the grave as not the end of the story of a life. And so we remember how fragile is this sweet experience called life. And we ask our merciful God to receive our beloved dead to a place of eternal peace and to bless us, the living, with courage to create an ever more just world. For the words of Pope Paul VI in the late 60's remain prophetic and wise, "If you want peace, work for justice".

Acabamos de escuchar algunas de las frases más fuertes y exigentes del mensaje moral de Jesús: "amad a vuestros enemigos, haced el bien a los que os odian, bendecid a los que os maldicen, orad por los que os injurian". Todas estas frases, fuera de su contexto, aisladas, pueden parecer exageradas, utópicas, absurdas... Pero ¿cuál es su contexto? El contexto es la situación en la histo-

¿Y cuál es esa historia? Resumiendo mucho, es esta: Dios nos crea sin necesitarnos para nada, por un puro acto de amor, por ser bueno, con el único fin de hacernos felices participando de su vida infinita. Pero nosotros, con nuestros pecados, le respondemos que no, le ofendemos y le rechazamos. La consecuencia es el infierno, que Dios nunca quiso, pero que nosotros forzamos con nuestro pecado. Todos merecemos el infierno, también tú y yo, porque le hemos dicho a Dios que no, que no queremos seguir sus planes, que no queremos estar con Él... Y el lugar donde Dios no está es el infierno, con todas sus terribles consecuencias. Pero, sin tener por qué hacerlo, siendo nosotros enemigos suyos por el pecado, **Dios nos amó, nos perdonó,** y nos devolvió la participación en su vida divina mediante la encarnación, muerte y resurrección de Cristo.

Por tanto, cuando Jesús nos dice: "amad a vuestros enemigos", nos está diciendo con otras palabras: haced lo que Dios Padre ha hecho con vosotros. No es ninguna exageración, ni ninguna locura cristiana... es lo justo. El mismo Jesús nos lo dice: "sed compasivos como vuestro Padre es compasivo". ¿Es que no voy a hacer yo con los demás lo que Dios ha hecho conmigo? Porque yo, al fin y al cabo, soy un hombre pecador, y en parte seguro que me merezco la ofensa que me han hecho; pero Dios es el santo, el justo ¡y yo lo he ofendido! Por eso, si Dios nos ha amado tanto, con ese amor que llamamos misericordia, que es su amor puesto en contacto con nuestra miseria--, lo único que nos está pidiendo Jesús es que hagamos lo mismo.

Y esta lógica del perdón, no solo es justa, sino que es necesaria. Tanto, que, **si no perdonamos a los demás**, no podemos recibir el perdón de Dios y por tanto **no podemos salvarnos**. Esto es lo que dice Jesús para terminar este discurso: "no juzguéis, y no seréis juzgados; no condenéis, y no seréis condenados; perdonad, y seréis perdonados". Es lo mismo que nos enseña en el Padrenuestro: "perdona nuestras ofensas, como también nosotros perdonamos a los que nos ofenden".

Pero esta lógica no solo tiene sentido para con Dios. Pensemos en nuestras relaciones con los demás aquí. ¿Cómo podemos parar cualquier espiral de odio o de violencia o de enemistad que se produzca? ¿Dando un golpe más fuerte? A lo mejor con eso se soluciona el problema temporalmente, pero a la larga el problema se empeora... La única solución para acabar con el odio y la enemistad es el perdón y el amor desinteresado. Por eso, pensemos en aquellas personas que más nos han ofendido en nuestra vida y perdonémoslas de verdad en nuestro corazón. ¡Que si no, no podemos ir al cielo...!

SANCUARY LAMPS:

You may donate to lighting the Sanctuary Candle in either the upstairs Church or in the St. Catherine of Siena Chapel in memory of a loved one. The red Sanctuary Lamp is always lit when the Real Presence is in the Tabernacle. There is a requested donation of \$15.00 which is used for the purchase of the candles. The Lamp will be lit for seven days (Sunday to Saturday) in memory of your loved one.



MASS FOR AN INTENTION AND MASS CARDS

It is a common and beautiful gesture for parishioners to ask to have Mass celebrated in memory of a deceased loved one and/or for some special intention. Praying for our loved ones who are deceased is a spiritual work of mercy. Customarily, an offering is made for a special intentioned Mass. In order to avoid any abuses about the celebration of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, Church law regarding the appropriate stipends for such requests is very specific and the standard offering requested for an intentioned Mass is \$15.00. Mass Cards are available at the Parish Center and are also \$15.00 (These are for Masses said privately by a priest)

The bulletin lists requests for intentioned Masses and who the Sanctuary Candle is lit for each week. Any requests to appear in the bulletin must be made no later than one week prior.
