Parable of the Unjust Steward



In order to appreciate fully the import of today's gospel text, which gives us the parable of the Unjust Steward, we must remember that parables, unlike allegories, focus on only one element in the comparison. Thus, the lesson to be drawn from this parable is that the followers of Jesus must also act prudently in regard to their own future prospects.

It should also be noted that this steward, though lacking in good management, was probably not as unjust as at first appears. In all likelihood, he was simply subtracting his own substantial commission from the debt owed to his master. This would be similar to the prudence of a small-market baseball team that trades away a good player because he is eligible for free agency and will be lost anyway!

The sayings that follow the parable sharpen its focus by making it clear that what Jesus has in mind is the attitude that his followers must adopt in regard to their earthly possessions, whether they be wealth or personal talents. If one allows these human and temporal things to monopolize one's attention, there is grave danger that the eternal treasure will be lost.

Life Implications

A distinctive feature of Luke's gospel is the deep concern he shows for the dangerous situation of wealthy or talented individuals who have become so engrossed in managing their riches that they are fatally distracted from the real purpose of human life. In this situation, they may very well be so distracted that they will discover, only when it is too late, that they have wasted the only ultimately significant opportunity in their lives. This same lesson is found in the situation of a strikingly beautiful person who has never needed to develop a mature and pleasing personality. This is what is meant when we speak of the "curse" of great talent.

This wisdom is also dramatically portrayed in Luke's parable of the rich man and Lazarus (16:19-31). It is important to notice that this rich man is never presented as one who has acquired his wealth through crime or some other immoral strategy. He ends up in hell simply because he is so preoccupied in managing his wealth

that he does not notice that a poor man is starving on his doorstep!

This sensitivity of Luke concerning the danger of earthy possessions derives in part from his observation of the effect of wealth on the inhabitants of his hometown of Antioch. This was a prosperous trading center where the extremes of wealth and poverty were clearly evident. Luke warns, therefore, that possessions can have, in a sense, a drugging effect on their owners. One sees this clearly in Luke's story of the rich farmer who is worrying about building bigger barns for his bountiful harvest whereas God is calling him to face final judgment (12:16-20).

Luke does not condemn wealth as such. What he does condemn is a preoccupation or obsession with riches that precludes one's need to place the awareness of others and of their needs at the top of one's list of responsibilities. When the gospel says that we must choose between God and mammon, it is asking us to declare where we finally put our trust. Wealth and talents can serve God's purposes, but they must never replace God as the center of our attention in life.

VIGÉSIMO QUINTO DOMINGO del Tiempo Ordinario

En este vigésimo quinto domingo del tiempo ordinario, la Iglesia nos insta a reflexionar sobre nuestra actitud hacia el dinero, las cosas materiales y especialmente, nuestra actitud hacia los pobres. Injusticia, avaricia, y opresión son entre los principales factores que han perpetuado la pobreza en nuestro mundo.

En la primera lectura, el profeta Amós condena la injusticia y la opresión contra los pobres. Escribió en un momento cuando los ricos tomaron posesión de todo terreno y “esclavizaron” a los pobres. Se exportaron alimentos para ganar más dinero para ellos mismos, mientras que los pobres sufrieron y murieron de hambre. Hoy, nos enfrentamos a una situación similar en nuestro mundo. Mientras que algunos no pueden conseguir una comida al día, otros malgastan dinero en proyectos inútiles. A veces, la excusa es que los pobres son perezosos, o que siempre habría los pobres en el mundo. Estas son excusas débiles. La verdad es que hay mucha codicia, injusticia y corrupción en nuestro mundo.

Hoy, Pablo nos llama a orar por gobernantes, líderes y autoridades. Esta oración es muy necesaria para su conversión y para que Dios los llena con su sabiduría. Si son convertidos y sabios, ayudarán a detener corrupción e injusticia en nuestro mundo y sistema. Esto es muy importante porque, como Pablo lo pone: “Dios quiere que todos sean salvos y alcancen el pleno conocimiento de la verdad.” Esta “verdad” es que, hay un solo Dios y todos somos sus hijos. Dios ama a todos, y desea que todos, prosperemos tanto en salud y en nuestras almas.

Una vez que entendamos esto, desaparecerá el egoísmo. Comenzaremos a tener en cuenta el interés y el bien de los demás. Es la voluntad de Dios que todos seamos salvos. Esto incluye ser salvado del hambre, injusticia, codicia y la corrupción que ha destruido nuestro mundo y dejado a muchos pobres.

En el Evangelio, Jesús nos recuerda el hecho de que las cosas materiales no duran para siempre. Por lo tanto, nos aconseja sobre cómo usarlos sin perder nuestra salvación. Hay un refrán que dice que: “La mejor manera de invertir es invertir en los pobres.” Por lo tanto, debemos aprender como invertir en los pobres para mejorar sus condiciones. La acumulación de riqueza solo para nosotros mismos sin utilizarlas para ayudar a los necesitados equivale a la avaricia y el egoísmo.

Dinero y la riqueza sólo tienen valor cuando se utilizan sabiamente para ayudar a los necesitados. Sólo los insensatos prestan más atención al dinero y a la riqueza que al Dios, y en detrimento de los pobres. Esto es porque son como “el insensato que dice que no hay Dios” (Sal 14:1). Por el contrario, el sabio usa su riqueza para ayudar a los necesitados. Por lo tanto, es importante saber que cuando somos bendecidos por Dios con riquezas, somos sólo su administrador. La riqueza es dada a nosotros para ayudar y mejorar las vidas de los necesitados. No es sólo para nosotros y nuestras familias. Así que, debemos ser caritativos con nuestra riqueza.

Por último, no debemos manipular a los pobres y los necesitados por ganancias económicas. Cualquier forma de injusticia y opresión contra los pobres clama de la tierra hacia a Dios como hizo la sangre de Abel (Gen 4:10). Cristo es el defensor de los pobres y los marginados. Como el salmista dice. “Dios levanta del polvo al pobre y saca del muladar al necesitado.”


