

Why Suffering?



He was an old man of indeterminate years. He was at the Spaulding Hospital and I found him in a beautiful room overlooking the harbor on a sunny Sunday afternoon. He looked terrible: broken shoulder, hip, scars and bruises and obviously in pain. When I spoke his name, one eye opened and Andrew (not his real name) focused on this priest standing by his bedside. I pulled over a chair and asked how he was doing – and began to listen.

It is a story not unfamiliar to many: the pains, aches and illnesses of aging combined with the accidents that accompany those of unsteady gait and balance. And Andrew's question was simple, sort of: *Why does God create us and then with suffering and pain, take our life away?*

The meaning of suffering - who of us has not pondered that question? Yet the question becomes especially poignant when one is suffering and/or accompanying a loved one through a crisis. In an article published in the New York Times some time ago, Pico Iyer reflected on the value of suffering:

Wise men in every tradition tell us that suffering brings clarity, illumination; for the Buddha, suffering is the first rule of life, and insofar as some of it arises from our own wrong-headedness – our cherishing of self – we have the cure for it within. Thus in certain cases, suffering may be an effect, as well as a cause, of taking ourselves too seriously. I once met a Zen-trained painter in Japan, in his 90s, who told me that suffering is a privilege, it moves us toward thinking about essential things and shakes us out of shortsighted complacency; when he was a boy, he said, it was believed you should pay for suffering, it proves such a hidden blessing.

Of course, in the Irish Catholic tradition (and in other traditions) suffering is thought to be payback from God for one's wrongdoing. Yet we all realize such thinking is senseless in the face of suffering of the innocent, for example a child and the victims of natural disasters, wars and so much more.

As Andrew and I continued our conversation, he explained his belief in God. Yet he was puzzled that God had allowed so much suffering to befall him. I asked if he believed God heard his prayers. He said he believed God hears all prayers, everyone's, but does not necessarily answer them as one wishes. As Andrew spoke more about his life, he laced his comments with humor and wise observations. I came to see a man whose vision, wisdom and faith were extraordinary. I wondered if the suffering that Andrew was enduring was actually a classroom of sorts where he was learning and living at a depth and faith that were preparing him for the life that God has prepared for him.

After celebrating the Sacrament of the Sick and praying with Andrew, he seemed in a very different place than when I first met him. As I rose to prepare to leave, he told me a joke, you know one of those about the rabbi and the priest ... I left his room chuckling and wondering about suffering, my own and that of countless others into whose lives I have been invited.

I conclude with the belief that all of life is a gift and never without meaning – ever. God is always at work in and around every one of us, in hard times and in good times. Our invitation to turn to this loving God, even in the darkness of suffering, loss and pain, is that call to go deeper, to the core of our being, and there to seek and find the Hope that is our Creator God.

VIGÉSIMO SEXTO DOMINGO del Tiempo Ordinario

En este vigésimo sexto domingo del tiempo ordinario, la Iglesia nos llama a ser justos y trabajar para la vida eterna. Por lo tanto, ella nos anima a ser dedicados y activos en la “buena batalla de la fe hasta la aparición del Señor.” Todas las lecturas de este domingo son continuaciones de las lecturas del domingo pasado. Ellas se centran en el día del juicio de Dios. Lo más importante, señalan el destino de los injustos y el triunfo y la comodidad de los pobres y justos.

En la primera lectura, el profeta Amós continúa su tratado contra los ricos y los afluentes de la sociedad que oprimen a los débiles y los pobres. Él pronuncia el juicio de Dios sobre aquellos que derivan de su gozo y comodidad de las miserias de los pobres y los débiles. Esta comodidad pronto desaparecerá como la nieve desaparece. En palabras de orden, su tiempo terminará pronto. Sus maldades finalmente serán reveladas y expuestas porque, el tiempo revela todas las cosas (“tempus omnia revelat”). De hecho, esto sería el triunfo y la comodidad de los pobres.

El Evangelio de hoy es único, en el sentido que se toca un aspecto muy importante de nuestra vida cristiana y creencia. Es decir, escatología, teología del fin del tiempo o de los últimos días. Primero se refiere a las tres últimas cosas muy importantes: muerte, juicio y recompensa – cielo o infierno (Heb 9:27). En segundo lugar, se refiere y reafirma a nosotros de la comodidad de los que lloran ahora en la tierra como Cristo prometió: “Bienaventurados los que lloran porque serán confortados (Mt 5:4).

Una lección muy importante del evangelio de hoy podría ser capturada en este dicho popular: “Hacer heno mientras que el sol brilla.” En palabras de orden, debemos prestar atención a las instrucciones de la buena nueva de la salvación mientras que todavía hay una gran oportunidad para nosotros. Comodidad excesiva y visualización de la prosperidad aquí en la tierra que no imparte positivamente en la vida de los demás, especialmente de los pobres, no nos beneficiará mucho al final de los tiempos. No garantizaran nuestro boleto en el seno de Abraham.

Por lo tanto, necesitamos que prestar atención a la palabra de Dios que oímos todos los días. Nos llama a usar nuestro poder terrenal para ayudar a los pobres y débiles. El verdadero discípulo sabio de Cristo es el que entiende este adagio latino: “*cotidiana vilescunt*” (las cosas cotidianas pierden su valor, no se aprecian). Esto es cien por ciento cierto y seguro. Las cosas conservan su valor sólo por servir y ayudar a la sociedad de la que se derivan. Así, siendo consciente de que este mundo pasará nos ayuda mucho a prepararnos para el reino eterno.

Sólo aquellos que están enfocados y no distraídos por la excesiva comodidad de este mundo fácilmente notarán y atenderán al Cristo en el “Lázaro” alrededor de ellos. Por último, a través de la segunda lectura de este domingo, Pablo nos aconseja: “Hermano, tú como hombre de Dios, lleva una vida de rectitud, piedad, fe, amor, paciencia y mansedumbre. Lucha en el noble combate de la fe, conquista la vida eterna a la que has sido llamado...” Esta llamada a la vida eterna es para todos.

Sin embargo, sólo aquellos que trabajan para ella con fe, amor, paciencia, ternura, reverencia para Dios y para otros, la alcanzarán. Sólo aquellos que muestran misericordia a los pobres, los débiles y los justos serían aceptados en el seno de Abraham. Es decir, el reino eterno, donde “mejores cosas se pueden esperar

The Truth About **Abortion** & **Women's Health**

Abortion does not save women's lives.

Abortion is the direct and intentional killing of a child in the womb.

Abortion is never medically necessary. It does not treat or solve any pregnancy-related complication.

Outlawing abortion will not affect treatment for miscarriage.

Treatment for miscarriage and abortion is not the same thing.

There is a complete moral and legal difference between losing a child through miscarriage and intentionally taking the life of a child.

In the tragic case of miscarriage, surgery may be necessary—and is an ethical treatment—to remove the remains of an unborn child who has *already died*.

While the same surgery is done to perform an abortion, abortions impose this procedure on a *living child* with the **intention** of ending his or her life.

Women can get the lifesaving treatments they need—without abortion.

In rare cases, and in the absence of better alternatives, life-threatening maternal health conditions may require interventions that **indirectly and unintentionally** lead to the death of an unborn child. **Abortion restrictions will not prevent women from receiving these treatments.**

When the lives of mother and child are in immediate danger, the goal is to fight to save both patients. **Effective treatments exist that seek to save the life of the mother and never to intentionally harm her unborn child.**

When a woman's life is at risk in pregnancy, preterm delivery may be used as a lifesaving medical intervention to preserve the life of both mother and child.¹

Ectopic pregnancies result when an embryo implants outside the uterus—often in the fallopian tube. Sadly, such embryos cannot survive and this condition can pose serious risks to the mother. While ectopic pregnancies sometimes resolve naturally, interventions are often necessary.

When done ethically, treatment for an ectopic pregnancy is not abortion. Ethical interventions include the removal of the damaged fallopian tube containing the embryo or, if embryo death has already occurred, medication can be used to resolve the ectopic pregnancy.

Bottom line: Abortion restrictions never prevent women from receiving life-saving treatment.²

ROSALIND MOHNSEN has performed in such venues as Merrill Auditorium in Portland, Maine, Woolsey Hall at Yale University, The National Shrine in Washington, D.C., Holy Cross Cathedral in Boston, and St. Thomas Church in New York City. She has performed for Boston's First Night, A.G.O. Chapters in Richmond, Lincoln and Pasadena, twenty-three national conventions of the Organ Historical Society, the 2014 A.G.O. National Convention in Boston, and in Riga, Latvia and Stockholm, Sweden. She has been a pianist in the BSO Symphony Café. She is Director of Music and Organist at Immaculate Conception Church of Malden/Medford, Massachusetts and was formerly on the faculty of Westmar College, LeMars, Iowa. 


