

The Parish Pastoral Council 2023

On Pentecost, May 28, 2023 at the 11:00 a.m. Family Mass, we will select names of persons who have been nominated and have accepted nomination to be members of our Parish Pastoral Council. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, four names will be selected by lot. The nomination process begins on the weekend of April 22/23. Only registered parishioners may nominate or be nominated.

Nominees must also participate in the sacramental life of the Church and be 18 years of age or older. PPC members must serve a full term of three (3) years and attend monthly meetings from September to June. As a consultative body, the Parish Pastoral Council is responsible to the pastor, assisting and supporting him in his leadership role. It recognizes the varied gifts of the parish members and invites them to an active leadership role in the parish.

The Council is an important means by which the pastor hears the voice of parishioners. In deliberations and consultation with the pastor, the council helps to unite the pastor and parishioners. Together they discern the pastoral needs of the parish and ways in which those needs can be addressed.

Once the nominations are in, the nominees will be contacted to see if they accept the nomination. If they do, their names will go into a "pot" for selection on Pentecost Sunday. Regardless of how many times people are nominated, their names are placed into the pot only once.

Please prayerfully consider possible candidates for the Council and submit their names no later than Tuesday, May 16th, to give us adequate time to contact the nominees prior to selection on Pentecost Sunday.

Nominate by filling out the 2023 Parish Council Nomination Form below. You may place the form in a the box on the table near the entrance of the church, mail it, drop it off at the Parish Center.

We thank departing members of the Council for their insight on serious issues and dedication to Parish initiatives. Our community is not complete without the guidance and support of such wonderful people.



4th Sunday of Easter

The life of a shepherd is difficult, filled with hard work, long hours and sleepless nights. To keep the sheep safe, a shepherd must watch them closely, herding them together and chasing after the one that strays. In all kinds of weather, the shepherd remains and guards his sheep. A good shepherd sacrifices a lot for the sake of his flock.

Jesus describes Himself as the Good Shepherd. He sacrifices Himself for the sake of His people and remains ever present and vigilant as he guides us on our journey of faith. He calls us by name and knows us better than we know ourselves. He gives us all that we need to follow Him and receive the life He promises. He describes Himself as the sheep gate, keeping us safe and guarding against the enemy. He leads us into the green pastures of life so no one can take us out.

We do not have to be afraid. Jesus has already destroyed sin and death. We trust in Him, accepting His love and mercy as we battle our own sins and failures. Through His compassion and forgiveness, we are re-made in His image, and led to the Father. He is indeed the Good Shepherd and we should follow Him wherever He may lead.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Today we recognize the World Day of Prayer for Vocations! Join us in prayer for young people seeking the will of God in their lives!

In Pope Francis's recent Apostolic Exhortation, Christ is Alive!, he writes, "The word 'vocation' can be understood in a broad sense as a calling from God, including the call to life, the call to friendship with him, the call to holiness, and so forth. This is helpful, since it situates our whole life in relation to the God who loves us. It makes us realize that nothing is the result of pure chance but that everything in our lives can become a way of responding to the Lord, who has a wonderful plan for us." (Christus Vivit, no. 248)



May is the Month of Mary!

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam she is one with all those who are to be saved. (Lumen Gentium, no. 53)

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed." The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf.




