En el Evangelio de este décimo segundo domingo ordinario escuchamos por tres veces la invitación de Jesús: No tengáis miedo. Se trata del discurso misionero del evangelio de san Mateo. Jesús alerta a sus apóstoles sobre las dificultades que encontrarán en su actividad misionera y los instruye sobre el falso temor a los hombres y el verdadero temor de Dios. Es, pues, una invitación llena de vigor a la confianza, a la seguridad en Dios (EV). La experiencia que vive el profeta Jeremías es semejante. Le ha tocado en suerte, como vocación divina, anunciar un mensaje de destrucción para Jerusalén. Un mensaje impopular que hiere los oídos de sus oyentes. Incluso sus amigos le dan la espalda y se vuelven contra él maquinando insidias e intrigas. "Pavor en torno". Sin embargo, Jeremías se levanta con

una confianza magnífica: el Señor está conmigo como fuerte soldado. (1L). La segunda lectura nos ofrece un nuevo texto de la carta a los romanos que venimos escuchando cada domingo. También aquí el elemento de confianza y seguridad subyace a la exposición del pecado y de la redención obtenida en Jesucristo. El tema de fondo de la liturgia es, por tanto, una contraposición entre el miedo del mundo, de los hombres y de la desesperación del pecado y la confianza en Dios que cuida providentemente de sus creaturas y se muestra como soldado que fortalece a los suyos. El bien ha triunfado sobre el mal y la muerte gracias a Cristo Jesús.

Apostles Peter and Paul

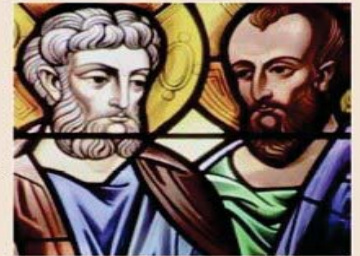
FIRST CENTURY
FEAST DAY: JUNE 29

These apostles share a feast as founders of the church in Rome. Peter, a Galilean fisherman chosen by Christ as one of the Twelve Apostles, became the undisputed leader of the fledgling church after Pentecost. Paul, a Pharisee and Roman citizen who had persecuted Christians, became after his dramatic conversion the church's greatest missionary, its "apostle of the gentiles." By tradition both were martyred in Rome. Their adventures are recounted in the Acts of the Apostles, and letters from them are included in the New Testament.

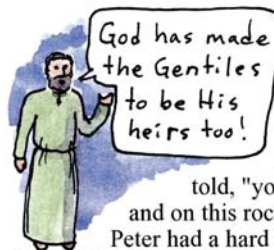

Peter and Paul

June 29th we celebrate the feast of Saints Peter and Paul.

Saint Peter had a hard time accepting that Jesus had to die, and he also denied Jesus. But he was sorry afterward and became a strong leader for the disciples after Jesus went back into Heaven. Saint Peter was the Church's first pope.

Saint Paul was a Jew who at first was against the Christians. He even helped to persecute them. But then Jesus appeared to him and Paul became a Christian and a great preacher. His mission was to preach to the Gentiles, the people who didn't know about God or His promises. He wrote many letters that are now part of the Bible.

Both Saint Peter and Saint Paul preached and taught about Jesus and brought the Faith to many people and places. But the Roman government did not like the Christians. The emperor Nero began killing the Christians, and among those killed were Peter and Paul. Their deaths didn't stop the Church from growing, though. When people die for God it brings even more grace into the Church.
