

From our Pastor ...

There's been a lot said recently about the atomic bomb as we near the 78th anniversary of its detonation. There is a moment in the life of J. Robert Oppenheimer, the brilliant physicist and leader of the team that developed the atomic bomb, when many years ago as a young teacher and scholar, one of his contemporaries caught him in front of a blackboard, chalk in hand, staring into space and mumbling over and again, "the point is...".

I think of today of St. Bonaventure, who helped us move the thinking of Philosophy to a deeper, more profound, and beautiful way of understanding of God in Theology, of how we as humans, in our pursuit of science and knowledge, as noble and important as is, we can lose the point of the entire enterprise, and when we do, we can fail, oh, so miserably. In so many ways, we can treat human lives as just figures on a board, not as the creation of a God who has placed each of us here for a holy and beautiful reason.

The pursuit of the secrets of this world and beyond are important and valuable, but a deeper understanding align them properly and help make our world more understandable, clearer, and better. The need will always be there to find a context that allows us not just to search into the "How?" of these things, we can come to a deeper and more profound meaning of the "Why?"- the workings of what is at the very heart of the Divine. This will allow us to open the door to the ethical implications of these important findings- of using not just how to make discover and create new things, but how to develop and use them in ways that make a difference to this earth and her inhabitants.

Einstein said this about God: "I want to know His thoughts; the rest are just details." He was not a religious man, but he had the point. With all we know, there is so much we don't - of our world, our universe, but no less, mysteries of our hearts and souls.

A few years ago, someone asked me what the most important thing is I've learned as a priest- I answered that as St. Paul reminds us in his letter to the Philippians 3:8:

> Everybody says love makes the world go round... I hear a bubbling and I hear a sound of my heart beating and I turn around and find you standing at the door. You know me, I like to dream a lot... of this and that, and what is not... and finally I figured out what was what... It was the power of the heart.

Search for the "How" in the mysteries- just keep asking "Why?" The answers will lead you to Christ. This world will change. The heart of Christ's love remains-let's find our joy and hope in Him.

Look up. Look ahead.

TRIGO Y CIZAÑA

Domingo 16º del Tiempo Ordinario. A

"Tú, poderoso soberano, juzgas con moderación y nos gobiernas con gran indulgencia, porque puedes hacer cuanto quieres" (Sab 12,18). La historia y nuestra propia experiencia nos dicen que los poderosos no siempre son clementes. Muchos de los que prometen hacer justicia, terminan ajusticiando a los demás.

Pero este texto del libro de la Sabiduría que se lee en este domingo 16º del Tiempo Ordinario nos recuerda que el poder de Dios se manifiesta precisamente en su misericordia. Obrando así nos ofrece la esperanza de ser perdonados y, al mismo tiempo, nos enseña que el justo debe ser humano.

Eso es lo que proclamamos en el salmo responsorial: "Tú, Señor, eres bueno y clemente" (Sal 85). Como escribe san Pablo, "el Espíritu viene en ayuda de nuestra debilidad, porque no sabemos pedir lo que nos conviene" (Rom 8,26).

EL SEMBRADOR Y SU ENEMIGO

De nuevo, el evangelio que hoy se proclama refleja el ámbito agrícola con un mensaje sobre la siembra y la cosecha (Mt 13,24-43). Y de nuevo el texto pone en boca de Jesús una parábola y le atribuye después una alegoría.

- La parábola refleja la paciencia de Dios. Él es el sembrador de la buena semilla. Trabaja a plena luz del día y permanece cerca del campo, acompañado por sus operarios que se muestran responsables y preocupados por la sementera. Pero se menciona también a un enemigo que actúa en la oscuridad, siembra una mala semilla y desaparece. A la prisa de los empleados por arrancar la cizaña, la parábola contrapone la gran paciencia del dueño.
- La explicación de Jesús se expresa en forma de alegoría. Los protagonistas son el Hijo del hombre que siembra buen trigo y el diablo que siembra cizaña. También las semillas tienen un significado. El trigo son los ciudadanos del Reino, mientras que la cizaña representa a los partidarios del Maligno. La alegoría anuncia que la cizaña será echada al fuego, suerte que espera a todos los malvados, que han nacido de la semilla sembrada por el Maligno.

LOS JUSTOS Y EL REINO

Llama la atención ver que la alegoría no se refiere al trigo, sino que pasa inmediatamente a mencionar a los que el trigo representa, que son los que han nacido de la semilla sembrada por el mismo Señor. ¿Y cuál es su suerte?

- "Los justos brillarán como el sol en el reino de su Padre". En primer lugar, es una alegría ver que los que han nacido de la iniciativa y de la semilla sembrada por el Hijo del hombre son calificados como "justos".
- "Los justos brillarán como el sol en el reino de su Padre". En segundo lugar, se evoca el hecho de que la buena semilla fue sembrada a pleno día. Y se anuncia para los justos un futuro de luz semejante a la del sol.
- "Los justos brillarán como el sol en el reino de su Padre". En tercer lugar, recordamos que la buena semilla son "los ciudadanos del reino". No es extraño que su destino y la plenitud de su vocación se sitúe precisamente en el reino de su Padre.
- Señor Jesús, tú conoces la confusión del mundo en el que vivimos. Te agradecemos la presencia de los buenos sembradores, te rogamos que nos libres de la cizaña que siembra el Maligno y que nos ayudes a dar el fruto bueno que pacientemente esperas de nosotros.

July 23 ~ Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Gospel today speaks to some everyday realities. Gardeners dealing with weeds growing among good plants, bakers knowing the importance of yeast in bread baking. Jesus uses parables to teach us lessons that we can identify with. At a deeper level, these parables highlight the importance of being discerning, of being patient, of allowing the life of God to grow and bear fruit in our lives. St. Paul reminds us that the Spirit is present knowing our intentions, aiding us when we don't feel up to the task of being an active disciple. What new growth is God nurturing and encouraging in you? How might you be "yeast" helping the life of God to grow in another? Reread today's gospel and pray for the grace to apply Jesus' message to your daily living.
