This story was shared with me recently:

A lady asked a farmer: "How much do you sell your eggs for?" The old vendor replies "50 cents an egg, madam." The lady says, "I'll take 6 eggs for \$2.50 or I'm leaving." The old salesman replies, "Buy them at the price you want, Madam. This is a good start for me because I haven't sold a single egg today and I need this to live." She bought her eggs at a bargain price and left with the feeling that she had won.

She got into her fancy car and went to a fancy restaurant with her friend. She and her friend ordered what they wanted. They are a little and left a lot of what they had asked for. They paid the bill, which was \$150. The ladies gave \$200 and told the fancy restaurant owner to keep the change as a tip...

This story might seem quite normal to the owner of the fancy restaurant, but very unfair to the egg seller...The questions it raises are: Why do we always need to show that we have power when we buy from the needy? Why are we generous to those who don't even need our generosity?

I once read this somewhere, that a father used to buy goods from poor people at high prices, even though he didn't need the things. Sometimes he paid more for them. I was amazed. One day his son asked him "Why are you doing this Dad?" His father replied: "It's charity wrapped in dignity, son."

Each one of us can do better. God gave us the power.



Y usted también tiene suerte porque Dios, con o sin lista, le perdona siempre. Los que tenemos lista y larga somos los hombres. El capítulo 18 del evangelio de Mateo es cono-

cido como el discurso eclesial, el discurso de la comunidad, de la vida de los creyentes. El perdón, perdonar, para nosotros es un adorno, un lujo. Para los seguidores de Jesús es una realidad vital, es el corazón del evangelio, es un estilo de vida. Jesús vivió, murió y resucitó para ofrecernos el perdón de Dios. Todo lo que hizo Jesús fue reconciliar el mundo y los hombres con Dios. El ministerio de Jesús fue un ministerio de perdón. "Tanto amó Dios al mundo que nos dio a su Hijo, a Jesucristo". ¿Para qué? Para abrirnos las puertas de su amor. Para reunir lo que estaba disperso. Para que conociéramos su ser más íntimo, Dios rico en perdón. Para decirte a través de Jesús: mi Padre te ama, te limpia, te sana y pone alegría en tu corazón herido por la vida.

El evangelio de Jesús es el evangelio del amor y sólo el amor sin límites y sin condiciones puede perdonar. Pueblo de Dios aquí reunido por el Señor Jesús y su Espíritu para escuchar el mensaje del perdón de Jesús. "El Reino de Dios es como un rey que perdonó a un deudor una deuda inmensa". Ese deudor es usted y yo. ¿Por dónde empezar? ¿Por mis enemigos? ¿Por mi marido? ¿Por mis hijos? ¿Por mi jefe?... Estos sí que son malos. ¿Por dónde empezar? No mire a nadie. Aquí, en la iglesia, empezamos siempre por nosotros, por mí. Todo empieza por mí. ¿Cuál es mi deuda con Dios? ¿Cuántas veces me ha perdonado Dios a lo largo de mi vida? Dios ha perdonado mi odio, mi lujuria, mi avaricia, mis infidelidades....

El perdón se siente pero se expresa y vive cuando entro en un proceso de conversión. El perdón de mi inmensa deuda es un poder creador de un corazón y una mente nueva. Todo empieza por mí. Yo me dejo perdonar. Yo me abro al amor de Dios. Yo pongo mi deuda en manos de Dios. Sin deuda, sin miedo, puedo caminar ligero al encuentro de mis hermanos. Y cuando salga ahí afuera, sabré que el ministerio de Jesús es el del perdón, nunca la venganza. Y cuando salga ahí afuera, sabré que lo que tengo que perdonar es poco comparado con lo que a mí Jesús me perdona cada día. Y cuando salga ahí afuera no haré lo del siervo malo que le dijo a su hermano. "paga lo que me debes".

Sólo los que no han experimentado el perdón de Dios, su inmenso amor, son incapaces de perdonar a los hermanos. Sólo cuando experimento el perdón de Dios, mi corazón se rompe, mis murallas se desvanecen y como no me queda nada que defender puedo ceder, rendirme e incluso perdonar. Es verdad, Jesús es muy exigente. Nunca dice: ésta es la gota que colma el vaso. Nos dice: no cuentes las ofensas, simplemente perdona. Tiene que saber que su deuda ha sido pagada y que ya no debe nada. Dios no necesita nada, pero sus hermanos sí. Dios no necesita ser perdonado, pero sus hermanos sí. Dios no cuenta sus pecados, sus ofensas, pero usted sí Y seguiremos preguntando ¿cuántas veces tengo que perdonar? El perdón no es una cuestión de matemáticas. Perdone siempre que sea ofendido como Dios lo hace con usted.
