



En un viaje hacia Madrid, a la hora de la cena, la azafata me preguntó: ¿desea cenar? Yo le pregunté: ¿cuáles son las opciones? "Sí o no", esas son las opciones, contestó la azafata. Tenemos el poder de elegir. Un no siempre puede convertirse en un sí. El primer hijo de la parábola está representado por los ancianos, los sacerdotes, los escribas, los conocedores de las Escrituras, los exploradores de todas las minucias de la Ley. Sus vidas aparentemente eran un sí.

Sus mentes y sus corazones no cambiaron y sus corazones no se transformaron ante el mensaje de Jesús. Jesús fue para ellos una decepción, no era su Mesías. El segundo hijo representa a los recaudadores de impuestos y prostitutas, gente sencilla y sin pretensiones inte-

lectuales... Sus vidas aparentemente eran un no. Juan Bautista predicó la conversión, la opción del sí a Jesús. Nuestra primera reacción es decir "no" al evangelio de Jesús. ¿Por qué? Porque es duro cargar con la cruz, es duro amar a los enemigos, es duro perdonar siempre, es duro orar por los que nos persiguen, es duro hacer siempre el bien... ¿Qué clase de mundo nos hace decir no?

El mundo de la violencia, de los niños hambrientos, el de la droga... El evangelio de hoy nos invita a vivir en el sí, en una obediencia no de palabras sino una obediencia en acción. Si decimos "sí" a Dios amor, debemos decir no al rechazo a los hermanos, a los que no nos caen bien. Si decimos "sí" al perdón ofrecido en la cruz, debemos decir no al deseo de venganza. Si decimos "sí" al Dios de la vida, debemos decir no a todo lo que mata la vida y la verdadera felicidad. Si decimos "sí" a la invitación que Dios nos hace a trabajar en su Iglesia, debemos decir no a la pereza, a la comodidad y a la haraganería. Si decimos "sí" a todo lo que engendra paz y alegría, debemos decir no a todo lo que destruye la paz y divide a los hombres. Si decimos "sí" al amor en el matrimonio, debemos decir no a las aventuras extramatrimoniales.

Jesús es el hombre del "sí" dice San Pablo. Sí y no, las dos palabras más poderosas e importantes que podemos decir. Dios dice "sí" a sus hijos, a todos. Nosotros somos invitados en este domingo a decir a Dios nuestro sí de todo corazón y decirlo con nuestra vida. El privilegio del pecador es poder cambiar, decir sí. El joven Teophanos sólo tenía un deseo, entregarse por completo a Dios. Así que un día se dirigió a un monasterio. Fue recibido por un viejo monje que le preguntó: ¿Qué quiere usted? Quiero entregarme a Dios, le contestó el joven. Éste esperaba que fuera amable y paternal, pero el viejo monje le gritó: AHORA.

Luego alcanzó un palo y le perseguía diciendo: AHORA, AHORA. Después de muchos años de monje aún le sigue por doquier diciéndole: AHORA. Y es que las cosas de Dios no hay que dejarlas para mañana. El sí a Dios, si es verdadero, hay que dárselo ya, ahora.

October 1 Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In our second reading today St. Paul expresses the need for unity within the community of Philippi. "Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves..." The same concern is of importance to each parish community. If we have Christ as our companion, his presence and love will keep us united to one another. St. Paul knew that a lack of unity, signs of divisiveness or a lack of harmony erodes the spirit of a community. What is Christ asking of us so that we can be united to him in our thinking and actions? This week, pray the prayer of St. Francis, whose feast we celebrate this week: "Lord, make me, [make us] instruments of your peace."


