# Tercer domingo

#### "El SEÑOR QUIERE QUE SEAMOS PASTORES NO SALVADORES".

¿Es cierto que Javier es discípulo suyo?, le preguntaron un día a un profesor. Sí, es cierto que Javier asiste a mis clases, pero no es mi discípulo. El alumdel tiempo ordinario no ocupa un pupitre por obligación, le guste o no la materia y el profesor. Aburrido, en su interior, maldice y espera impaciente el final de la clase. El discípulo se

entusiasma, admira, se identifica con la materia y el profesor y desea imitarle. Nosotros, los que aún frecuentamos la escuela de Jesús y escuchamos sus enseñanzas domingo tras domingo, los que usamos su nombre y nos definimos como cristianos, corremos el riesgo de convertirnos en meros alumnos mientras que Jesús quiere que seamos discípulos.

Ser cristiano es algo instantáneo, uno se bautiza y misión cumplida, uno queda afiliado a una institución virtual de por vida mientras que ser discípulo es tarea de toda la vida, es seguimiento ininterrumpido. Nunca somos cristianos del todo porque tenemos que luchar para que las experiencias de la vida cotidiana no apaguen el entusiasmo y el aburrimiento no se instale en la vida del discípulo. Los católicos confundimos muchas veces la religión con la espiritualidad. Ser religioso es tener ideas, creencias, ritos, novenas...todo un recetario fijo e inmutable. El espíritu, imprevisible e incontrolable, se anestesia.

Marcos en el evangelio de este domingo nos exhorta a convertirnos y a creer en el evangelio.

A Dios no le interesa nuestro pasado, nos invita a creer que podemos crecer, que podemos cambiar y ser personas nuevas, transformadas por la fuerza del evangelio. Convertirse diariamente no es una extravagancia, es una necesidad del discípulo que quiere asemejarse y entusiasmarse más y más con su Maestro. Marcos, después de esta brevísima introducción y de este primer mensaje de Jesús: conversión y fe, sin más preámbulos llama a sus primeros discípulos.

Marcos enfatiza la llamada y elude el proceso de discernimiento de los llamados. Seguro que no sería tan sencillo como nos lo hace creer. Los llamado tenían familias que dejar, trabajos que atender, negocios que liquidar, amistades que despedir...; y el futuro? ¿Llamados para qué? Ninguna explicación, sólo una respuesta aparentemente irracional.

A todos nos cuesta dejar lo familiar, lo de siempre. A todos nos cuesta emprender nuevas tareas y nos consolamos diciendo: más vale malo conocido que bueno por conocer. La llamada de Jesús no nos seduce. Los hombres de hoy son seducidos por las celebridades efímeras del momento. El sígueme de Jesús siempre fue difícil, pero hoy lo es más. Pedro, Andrés, Santiago y Juan inmediatamente lo dejaron todo y se comprometieron con Jesús y lo primero fue estar con Jesús, conocerlo y entusiasmarse con él. Pero seguro que no fue tan sencillo ni tan inmediato aunque Marcos nos presente a estos cuatro primeros discípulos como modelos para nosotros. Ser discípulo de Jesús no es ponerse una camisa de fuerza que te paraliza, es vivir la libertad y la alegría, revestirse de la condición de servidor de la causa del Reino, de la lealtad y del amor a Dios y a los hombres.

Música celestial, palabras, palabras... Optar por Jesús y ser su discípulo es mucho más que palabras, es mucho más que una tarea meramente humana, es también tarea del Espíritu, sin su presencia y ayuda sería imposible.

Si Dios pudo abrir la tumba que retenía prisionero a Jesús, también puede hacer algo hermoso con nosotros, nos puede convertir en pastores, pero, por favor, dejemos que se ocupe Él de la salvación.

Begin to break open God's Word in your home by dedicating some family time each week for a brief reading of a Scripture passage, perhaps the Sunday Gospel. Given the hectic and stressed pace of life and our typically overworked schedules, making family time for the Bible reminds us of the need to put God - rst. Gathering around the table of God's Word enriches and strengthens the experience of family as a "domestic Church."

Choose a comfortable and quiet place in the home, away from the distractions of television and ringing telephones. Read the passage aloud, and then allow some time for the family to re ect on and share its meaning together. Since Sacred Scripture is the "speech of God as it is put down in writing under the breath of the Holy Spirit" (CCC, no. 81, quoting Second Vatican Council, Dei Verbum, no. 9), this time dedicated to reading puts your family into living communication with God. Remind everyone gathered that this family activity brings them to a living encounter with Christ, who is present as the Word among them.


#### Blessing of the Throats at all Masses on the weekend of February 3-4 St. Blaise

According to the Acts, while Blaise was being taken into custody, a distraught mother, whose only child was choking on a fishbone, threw herself at his feet and implored his intercession. Touched

at her grief, he offered up his prayers, and the child was cured. Consequently, Saint Blaise is invoked for protection against injuries and illnesses of the throat.

#### January 21 ~ Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

Today's gospel gives us another version of the call of the disciples. Again, it starts with an invitation. Jesus invites the disciples to "come after him" that is, to come to friendship with him and imitate him. They did just that and therefore were able bring others to Christ. What Jesus did with those first disciples, he does for us, if we are willing to come to friendship with him. Now, the challenge before us is - will we take the next step, to share our friendship with Christ with others. It's time to put aside our lack of confidence and to hear what Jesus says to us today, "come after me and I will make you fishers of men [and women]" How will you respond? What action will you take?



#### St. Francis de Sales Feast Day January 24. Bishop and Doctor of the Church


Francis de Sales (Aug 21, 1567 to Dec 28, 1622) was trained to be a lawyer and meant to succeed his father as a provincial senator in France. The young man changed his mind after his

doctorate and wanted to join the priesthood; it took some effort to convince his parents. After ordination, he found success in converting Calvinists in Geneva and went on to greater things. He was made a bishop of Geneva at the age of 35. The gentle personality and kindness of Francis de Sales was well known. His words are sweet and encouraging to the faithful: "The person who possesses Christian meekness is affectionate and tender towards everyone: he is disposed to forgive and excuse the frailties of others; the goodness of his heart appears in a sweet affability that influences his words and actions, presents every object to his view in the most charitable and pleasing light." He is known also for his writings on the topic of spiritual direction and spiritual formation, particularly the Introduction to the Devout Life and the Treatise on the Love of God. He is the patron saint of writers and journalists and the deaf.



# "I have two words for Long Covid – the worst," shares Eric T. of Burlington, MA.

While the initial alarm of the Covid-19 outbreak has subsided, the pandemic is ongoing. The spread may have slowed but we continue to feel the long-term impacts. Nearly 23 million Americans (100 million people globally) have learned that regardless of the severity of their initial infection, they may continue to experience debilitating symptoms for weeks, months, or even years. In a number of cases, these symptoms worsen with time, even turning deadly.

"I got Covid early last year, and it was pretty bad," shares Eric. "I was hospitalized for 9 days, and there was a point where I wasn't sure I would make it. I'm still here, so I guess God had other plans but months passed, and I was still gasping for air.
