On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics ages 18-59- in reasonable health- are called to eat only one full meal and two smaller meals which, combined, would not equal a single normal

meal. Those 14 years and older are called to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent.

Catholics are also encouraged to engage in acts of kindness, justice, and mercy as well as abstain or refrain from something one would normally indulge in to mark the nature of the season. For young children, parents should communicate the meaning and importance of Lent.

Stations of the Cross

The Stations will be prayed at St. Francis Church on Fridays throughout Lent at 6:30 pm. Gather with us and walk the steps of Christ.

On **Sunday, Feb. 18**, after the 11 am Mass, folks from our Collaborative will join with Cardinal Sean and hundreds of candidates and catechumens for the Rite of Welcoming at the Cathedral that afternoon. Through the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, they will be brought into the fullness of the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil on March 31st. Please pray for them.

ASH WEDNESDAY - Lent Begins February 14, 2024

Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer.

Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is chiefly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it too.

Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. Writings from the Second-century Church refer to

the wearing of ashes as a sign of penance. All are invited to accept the ashes as a visible symbol of penance. Small children, the elderly and sick are exempt from this observance. Ashes also available at the Collaborative Office (Parish office at 46 Winthrop Street) from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm for those unable to get to a Mass or prayer service at the Church.

«Estoy perdido… No hay nada que hacer.» Qué duro es escuchar a quien se nos confía con estas o parecidas palabras. Pocos sentimientos habrá tan penosos para el ser humano como esa sensación de verse hundido sin remedio.

Todo se desata, a veces, a partir de una desgracia que el individuo se siente incapaz de soportar: «Es demasiado para mí. No puedo más. Voy a volverme loco.» La persona no sabe dónde encontrar consuelo. Ya nada será como antes. Algo se ha roto para siempre.

Otras veces es la soledad sentida de manera angustiosa: «Nadie me entiende. Nadie me

quiere. Todos me han dejado solo.» Frustrada en lo más íntimo, la persona se hunde en la amargura. Sabe que nadie le espera ya en ningún lugar. ¿Qué sentido puede tener seguir viviendo sin la presencia de una persona amada?

En algunos momentos puede aparecer una inexplicable sensación de malestar: «No tengo ganas de vivir. Nada me llena. Todo me da igual.» La persona no sabe cómo sacudirse de encima esa fastidiosa impresión de vacío y falsedad. Hay que seguir viviendo, pero uno se siente acabado.

En otras ocasiones el ser humano experimenta el cansancio de su propio corazón: «Estoy harto de todo y de todos.» Una especie de entumecimiento interior se apodera de la persona. Hay que «seguir tirando», pero hace tiempo que la vida se ha apagado.

No es tampoco tan extraña la experiencia del pecado: «Mi vida es un desastre. He dado muchos pasos equivocados. Poco a poco me he ido alejando de Dios, y ahora no tengo fuerzas para cambiar.» La persona no se atreve ya a enfrentarse a su propia conciencia. Siente confusamente el peso de la culpa, pero no sabe cómo salir de ese estado.

Las parábolas de la oveja perdida, la moneda perdida y el hijo perdido (*Lucas 15, 1-32*) insisten todas ellas en lo mismo: Dios es alguien que se alegra con la recuperación de todo hombre o mujer que se veía perdido. No hay desgracia ni pecado, no hay cansancio ni soledad, no hay crimen ni oscuridad que te pueda destruir definitivamente. Nadie está perdido para Dios.

Esta es la Buena Noticia del evangelio: No hay desesperación definitiva; siempre se puede seguir esperando incluso «contra toda esperanza». Dios es Salvador para todos aquellos que se ven desbordados por el mal, el pecado, la impotencia o la fragilidad. Esto es lo que descubren con admiración aquellas gentes de Galilea que son testigos del poder y la bondad de Jesús que libera del *«espíritu inmundo»* a aquel pobre hombre que se retuerce poseído por el mal.

January 28 ~ Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Mark makes clear in today's Gospel that Jesus spoke with a different kind of authority, an authority or confidence that arose from his own prayer and personal relationship with the Father. Everything Jesus did, his words, his deeds, his response to those in need, all sprang from that relationship. This gospel gives us a little push to reflect on our own words and actions. During this coming week take time to speak to Christ about his relationship with the Father and to consider whether what we say and do arises from our relationship with God. Ask for the grace to speak with the confidence of Christ about his/our Father!



St. Blaise–Blessing of the Throats at all Masses on the weekend of February 3-4

According to the Acts, while Blaise was being taken into custody, a distraught mother, whose only child was choking on a fishbone, threw herself at his feet and implored his intercession. Touched at her grief, he offered up his prayers, and the child was cured. Consequently, Saint Blaise is invoked for protection against injuries and illnesses of the throat.



THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD FEBRUARY 2

The Presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the "light of the nations" and the "glory of Israel." (CCC, no. 529)



"I have two words for Long Covid – the worst," shares Eric T. of Burlington, MA.

While the initial alarm of the Covid-19 outbreak has subsided, the pandemic is ongoing. The spread may have slowed but we continue to feel the long-term impacts. Nearly 23 million Americans (100 million people globally) have learned that regardless of the severity of their initial infection, they may continue to experience debilitating symptoms for weeks, months, or even years. In a number of cases, these symptoms worsen with time, even turning deadly.

"I got Covid early last year, and it was pretty bad," shares Eric. "I was hospitalized for 9 days, and there was a

point where I wasn't sure I would make it. I'm still here, so I guess God had other plans but months passed, and I was still gasping for air. I couldn't do everyday tasks like cutting the grass or working in the yard, much less enjoy a quick bike ride. And then there was what my doctor called 'brain fog.' I'd lose my train of thought mid-sentence or forget words for stupid things like plates and toilet paper. It felt like I'd had a stroke more than it did a virus."

Officially dubbed Long Covid, the aftermath of the original virus has taken on a life of its own. Dozens of symptoms have been reported, including shortness of breath and cognitive issues to a sudden onset of diabetes and cardiothoracic conditions. These symptoms are so well-documented and common that those suffering now qualify for disability assistance.

Unfortunately for Eric and so many others, the treatment options thus far have been limited.

"I started with my primary care doctor and saw specialist after specialist. A pulmonologist finally told me 'this is the best we can do for you, it's time you start thinking about how you're going to live with Long Covid.' Apparently, their best was letting me live what felt like half a life."

Eric wasn't satisfied with that and resigned to doing his own research, which is how he ended up here at AWC Acupuncture & Wellness Clinic. "I fully believe the human body has the ability to heal itself, but sometimes it needs a little push. 
