

Saint Patrick

he patron saint of Ireland, Patrick was born in Roman Britain. He describes his life and ministry, including his work to convert the Irish people, in his short autobiography and testimony, Confess-ions. Kidnapped at age 16 by Irish raiders and sold into slavery in Ireland, his time spent in captivity transformed him spiritually. He was a lonely shepherd for six years before escaping and returning home.

After returning home, his dream of converting the Irish from pagan belief propelled him to priestly studies in Gaul (now France). In about 432, Pope Celestine I consecrated him as a bishop and sent him to Ireland. For nearly 30 years, he preached tirelessly, made countless converts, founded monasteries, and established the primatial see at Armagh in modern-day Northern Ireland.

Toward the end of his life, he made a 40-day retreat on Croagh Patrick mountain in present-day County Mayo. That gave rise to the pilgrimages that are made on the mountain to this day. Stories that Patrick used the shamrock to explain the Trinity and drove snakes from the island are unconfirmed legend.





St. Joseph is also patron saint of the Universal Church, families, fathers, expectant mothers (pregnant women), travelers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen, engineers, and working people in general and also a happy death

A Very Special Message from Our Lady of Knock Shrine from John Volpe

Deeply rooted in the heritage of St. Mary's- St. Catherine and of course St. Francis de Sales parishes, is a lovely hymn, Lady of Knock. There are actually two versions of this hymn and both are gorgeous in their own right. One version was written by Fr. John MacGillivray in 1879, however the version we are most familiar with was written by Dana Scallon in 1981, released in 1988.

Fortunately, a while back, I had the opportunity to work with a very special member of the Knock Shrine Music Department, at my first assignment at St. Michael Church in Hudson, Mass. We have been able to stay in touch over the years, especially around St. Patrick's Day. She recently wrote us a little note:

Hello to all of our friends in St Mary-St Catherine of Siena Parish from Knock Shrine.

Knock is a small village in the west of Ireland with a big history. In 1879 the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, St. John the Evangelist and an altar with a lamb appeared at the gable wall of the parish church for two hours in the pouring rain. Fifteen local people witnessed the apparition and as word spread of this amazing happening pilgrims began coming to pray at the site whereit had occurred. Today, Knock is a thriving pilgrimage site with almost 1 million visitors coming in the year 2022 despite restrictions!

We would be delighted to have your wonderful cantor and organist, John Anthony, to sing here at one of our ceremonies and indeed would love to have you come on pilgrimage to us some time!



LENTEN PRAYER AND RECONCILIATION SERVICE WEDNESDAY, MARCH 20 - 7PMAN AT SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES CHURCH

As we enter into the days before Holy Week, set an hour aside and come to our Lenten evening of prayer. In a serene and reflective atmosphere, we will pray together as a community of faith, contemplating God's love, mercy, and action in our lives. The evening will conclude with an opportunity for individual confession.

Quinto domingo de cuaresma

En este quinto domingo de Cuaresma, el evangelista Juan nos llama la atención con un particular curioso: algunos «griegos», de religión judía, llegados a Jerusalén para la fiesta de la Pascua, se dirigen al apóstol Felipe y le dicen: «Queremos ver a Jesús» (Jn 12, 21). En la ciudad santa, donde Jesús fue por última vez, hay mucha gente. Están los pequeños y los sencillos, que han acogido festivamente al profeta de Nazaret reconociendo en Él al Enviado del Señor. Están los sumos sacerdotes y los líderes del pueblo, que lo quieren eliminar porque lo consideran heréti-

co y peligroso. También hay personas, como esos «griegos», que tienen curiosidad por verlo y por saber más acerca de su persona y de las obras realizadas por Él, la última de las cuales—la resurrección de Lázaro— causó mucha sensación.

«Queremos ver a Jesús»: estas palabras, al igual que muchas otras en los Evangelios, van más allá del episodio particular y expresan algo *universal*; revelan *un deseo que atraviesa épocas y culturas*, un deseo presente en el corazón de muchas personas que han oído hablar de Cristo, pero no lo han *encontrado* aún. «Yo deseo ver a Jesús», así siente el corazón de esta gente.

Respondiendo indirectamente, de modo profético, a aquel pedido de poderlo ver, Jesús pronuncia una profecía que revela su identidad e indica el camino para conocerlo verdaderamente: «Ha llegado la hora de que sea glorificado el Hijo del hombre» [n 12, 23]. ¡Es *la hora de la Cruz*! Es la hora de la derrota de Satanás, príncipe del mal, y del triunfo definitivo del amor misericordioso de Dios. Cristo declara que será *«levantado sobre la tierra»* (v. 32), una expresión con doble significado: «levantado» en cuanto crucificado, y *«levantado»* porque fue exaltado por el Padre en la Resurrección, para atraer a todos hacia sí y reconciliar a los hombres conDios y entre ellos. La hora de la Cruz, la más oscura de la historia, es también la fuente de salvación para todos los que creen enÉl.

Continuando con la profecía sobre su Pascua ya inminente, Jesús usa una imagen sencilla y sugestiva, la del *grano de trigo»* que, al caer en la tierra, muere para dar fruto (cf. v. 24). En esta imagen encontramos otro aspecto de la Cruz de Cristo: el de la*fecundidad*. La cruz de Cristo es fecunda. La muerte de Jesús, de hecho, es una fuente inagotable de vida nueva, porque lleva en sí la fuerza regeneradora del amor de Dios. Inmersos en este amor por el Bautismo, los cristianos pueden convertirse en «granos de trigo» ydar mucho fruto si, al igual que Jesús, «pierden la propia vida» por amor a Dios y a los hermanos (cf. v. 25).

Por este motivo, a aquellos que también hoy «quieren ver a Jesús», a los que están en búsqueda del rostro de Dios; a quien rœibió una catequesis cuando era pequeño y luego no la profundizó más y quizá ha perdido la fe; a muchos que aún no han encontrado a Jesús personalmente...; a todas estas personas podemos ofrecerles tres cosas: *el Evangelio; el Crucifijo y el testimonio* de nuestra fe, pobre pero sincera. El Evangelio: ahí podemos encontrar a Jesús, escucharlo, conocerlo. El Crucifijo: signo del amor de Jesúsque se entregó por nosotros. Y luego, una fe que se traduce en gestos sencillos de caridad fraterna. Pero principalmente en la coherencia de vida: entre lo que decimos y lo que vivimos, coherencia entre nuestra fe y nuestra vida, entre nuestras palabras y nuestras æciones. Evangelio, Crucifijo y testimonio. Que la Virgen nos ayude a llevar estas tres cosas.

March 17 ~ Fifth Sunday of Lent

Jesus presents us with an amazing paradox in today's Gospel. He tells us that only by death comes life; only by spending our life do we preserve it; and only through service will come greatness. In this Gospel, Jesus calls us to live in a way that goes counter to what the world preaches. We will find life if we live by his word. In the remaining days of Lent, pray for the grace to make the necessary changes in your life to live in imitation of Christ.


