The Gallagher Scholarship

Reverend Henry M. Gallagher was born in Charlestown in 1910 and ordained in 1941. He served as spiritual director of Saint Mary's conference of the **Saint Vincent de Paul Society** and arranged scholarships for Boston College High School students and seminarians. Upon his death, Fr. Gallagher left a bequest to St. Vincent de Paul Society, which has helped college students with tuition in a scholarship program for more than a decade.

Gallagher Scholarship applications are now available for those entering their first year of college. The scholarship of \$1,000 will be awarded in two payments directly to the student. Students must be a member of St. Mary-St. Catherine of Siena Parish or St. Francis de Sales Parish and must provide the name of the school they will attend along with an acceptance letter.

El Domingo de Ramos es la única ocasión, en todo el año, en que se escucha por entero el relato evangélico de la Pasión. Lo que más impresiona, leyendo la pasión según Marcos, es la relevancia que se da a la traición de Pedro. Primero es anunciada por Jesús en la última cena; después se describe en todo su humillante desarrollo.

Esta insistencia es significativa, porque Marcos era una especie de secretario de Pedro y escribió su Evangelio uniendo los recuerdos y las informaciones que le llegaban precisamente de él. Fue por lo tanto el propio Pedro quien divulgó la historia de su traición. Hizo una especie de con-

fesión pública. En el gozo del perdón encontrado, a Pedro no le importó nada su buen nombre y su reputación como cabeza de los apóstoles. Quiso que ninguno de los que, a continuación, cayeran como él, desearan del perdón.

Es necesario leer la historia de la negación de Pedro paralelamente a la de la traición de Judas. También ésta es pre-anunciada por Cristo en el cenáculo, después consumada en el Huerto de los Olivos. De Pedro se lee que Jesús se volvió y «le miró» (Lc 22,61); con Judas hizo más aún: le besó. Pero el resultado fue bien distinto. Pedro, «saliendo fuera, rompió a llorar amargamente»; Judas, saliendo fuera, fue a ahorcarse.

Estas dos historias no están cerradas; prosiguen, nos afectan de cerca. ¡Cuántas veces tenemos que decir que hemos hecho como Pedro! Nos hemos visto en la situación de dar testimonio de nuestras convicciones cristianas y hemos preferido mimetizarnos para no correr peligros, para no exponernos. Hemos dicho, con los hechos o con nuestro silencio: «¡No conozco a ese Jesús de quien habláis!».

Igualmente la historia de Judas, pensándolo bien, en absoluto nos es ajena. El padre Primo Mazzolari tuvo una predicación famosa un Viernes Santo sobre «nuestro hermano Judas», haciendo ver cómo cada uno de nosotros habría podido estar en su lugar. Judas vendió a Jesús por treinta denarios, ¿y quién puede decir que no le ha traicionado a veces hasta por mucho menos? Traiciones, cierto, menos trágicas que la suya, pero agravadas por el hecho de que nosotros sabemos, mejor que Judas, quién era Jesús.

Precisamente porque las dos historias nos afectan de cerca, debemos ver qué marca la diferencia entre una y otra: por qué las dos historias, de Pedro y de Judas, acaban de modo tan distinto. Pedro tuvo remordimiento de lo que había hecho, pero Judas también tuvo remordimiento, tanto que gritó: «¡He traicionado sangre inocente!», y devolvió los treinta denarios. ¿Dónde está entonces la diferencia? Sólo en una cosa: Pedro tuvo confianza en la misericordia de Cristo, ¡Judas no!

En el Calvario, de nuevo, ocurre lo mismo. Los dos ladrones han pecado igualmente y están manchados de crímenes. Pero uno maldice, insulta y muere desesperado; el otro grita: «Jesús, acuérdate de mí cuando estés en tu reino», y se le oye responder: «Yo te aseguro: hoy estarás conmigo en el Paraíso» (Lc 23,43).

Vivir la Pascua significa vivir una experiencia personal de la misericordia de Dios en Cristo. Una vez un niño, al que se le había relatado la historia de Judas, dijo con el candor y la sabiduría de los niños: «Judas se equivocó de árbol para ahorcarse: eligió una higuera». «¿Y qué debería haber elegido?», le preguntó sorprendida la catequista. «¡Debía colgarse del cuello de Jesús!». Tenía razón: si se hubiera colgado del cuello de Jesús, para pedirle perdón, hoy sería honrado como lo es San Pedro.

Conocemos el antiguo «precepto» de la Iglesia: «Confesarse una vez al año y comulgar al menos en Pascua». Más que una obligación, es un don, un ofrecimiento: es ahí donde se nos ofrece la ocasión de «colgarnos del cuello» de Jesús.



March 24 ~ Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

While we know how today's scripture ends, make every effort to listen to the passion narrative as if hearing it for the first time. Pay attention to your feelings as you listen to each reading. What do you hear that you don't recall having heard before? Does the reading from Isaiah call me to confess that Jesus is Lord? In response to St. Paul, am I willing to be humble in my service? In response to the passion account, am I ready and willing to share Christ's extraordinary love with others? During this week called "holy" make an extra effort to ponder the paschal mystery - Christ's life, death and resurrection - his saving action for you.




Way of the Cross 2024 in the city of Boston - Communion and Liberation
