



ATRAÍDOS POR EL PADRE HACIA JESÚS

Según el relato de Juan, Jesús repite cada vez de manera más abierta que viene de Dios para ofrecer a todos un alimento que da vida eterna. La gente no puede seguir escuchando algo tan escandaloso sin reaccionar. Conocen a sus padres. ¿Cómo puede decir que viene de Dios? A nadie nos puede sorprender su reacción. ¿Es razonable creer en Jesucristo? ¿Cómo podemos creer que en ese hombre concreto, nacido poco antes de morir Herodes el Grande, y conocido por su actividad profética en la Galilea de los años treinta, se ha encarnado el

Misterio insondable de Dios.

Jesús no responde a sus objeciones. Va directamente a la raíz de su incredulidad: "No sigáis murmurando". Es un error resistirse a la novedad radical de su persona obstinándose en pensar que ya saben todo acerca de su verdadera identidad. Les indicará el camino que pueden seguir. Jesús presupone que nadie puede creer en él si no se siente atraído por su persona. Es cierto. Tal vez, desde nuestra cultura, lo entendemos hoy mejor. No nos resulta fácil creer en doctrinas o ideologías. La fe y la confianza se despiertan en nosotros cuando nos sentimos atraídos por alguien que nos hace bien y nos ayuda a vivir.

Pero Jesús les advierte de algo muy importante: "Nadie puede aceptarme si el Padre, que me ha enviado, no se lo concede". La atracción hacia Jesús la produce Dios mismo. El Padre que lo ha enviado al mundo despierta nuestro corazón para que nos acerquemos a Jesús con gozo y confianza, superando dudas y resistencias. Por eso hemos de escuchar la voz de Dios en nuestro corazón y dejarnos conducir por él hacia Jesús. Dejarnos enseñar dócilmente por ese Padre, Creador de la vida y Amigo del ser humano: "Todo el que escucha al Padre y recibe su enseñanza me acepta a mí".

La afirmación de Jesús resulta revolucionaria para aquellos judíos. La tradición bíblica decía que el ser humano escucha en su corazón la llamada de Dios a cumplir fielmente la Ley. El profeta Jeremías había proclamado así la promesa de Dios: "Yo pondré mi Ley dentro de vosotros y la escribiré en vuestro corazón".

Las palabras de Jesús nos invitan a vivir una experiencia diferente. La conciencia no es solo el lugar recóndito y privilegiado en el que podemos escuchar la Ley de Dios. Si en lo íntimo de nuestro ser, nos sentimos atraídos por lo bueno, lo hermoso, lo noble, lo que hace bien al ser humano, lo que construye un mundo mejor, fácilmente nos sentiremos invitados por Dios a sintonizar con Jesús.

August 11 ~ Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Elijah was ready to give up, "This is enough O Lord. Take my life...", but God would hear none of it: "Get up and eat..." Our Gospel gives us the beautiful Bread of Life discourse, in which Jesus reminds us again that He is the Bread of Life and that "...whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Do you hear some hints of last week's Gospel? When we are tempted to give up or stop trying to imitate Jesus, due of frustration, or discouragement, or the disapproval of others, remember that Jesus is here in the community and most importantly in the Eucharist, each week, waiting to feed us with himself, the Bread of Life. As God did with Elijah, He also invites us to "Get up and eat!"

RCIA (The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is a program for Catholics who have not had the opportunity to receive the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation; for Adults who are members of another religion or have never been baptized and want to know more about and perhaps become a member of the Catholic faith.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

August 15th

What is the Assumption?

The first name of this solemnity was the Feast of Mary, Mother of God. Later, its name in the East carried over, the Dormition (or Falling Asleep) of Mary. In the West, it became known as the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This solemnity celebrates the fact that Mary's Assumption is "a pledge of the future participation of the members of the mystical Body of Christ in the paschal glory of the Risen Christ." It shows that the Lord "reserves a munificent reward for his humble Servant because of her faithful cooperation with the divine plan, which is a destiny of fullness, happiness, glorification of her immaculate soul, her virginal body, perfect configuration to her Risen Son" (Directory, no. 180). The Mass has a proper vigil, and the solemnity replaces the Mass of the day when it occurs on a Sunday in Ordinary Time.



What does this all mean?

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which the Church celebrates every year on August 15. Simply put, the dogma of the Assumption states that at the end of her life, the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken, body and soul, into Heaven.

While this event isn't reflected in Sacred Scripture, it is clearly part of the Church's earliest observance. In the sixth century, St. John Damascene wrote in one of his sermons, "Your sacred and happy soul, as nature will have it, was separated in death from your most blessed and immaculate body, and although the body was duly interred, it did not remain in the state of death, neither was it dissolved by decay; your most pure and sinless body was not left on earth, but you were transferred to your heavenly throne."

Theologically speaking, death is often understood to be a consequence of original sin. Since Mary was conceived without Original Sin, some theologians have wondered if Mary died or if perhaps she was taken into Heaven without experiencing death. The Catechism of the Catholic Church doesn't answer this question but simply states, "The most blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven" (no. 974)

The Solemnity of the Assumption reminds us of the unique role that Mary served in the process of our salvation. Although she was without sin, we have the possibility of receiving God's forgiveness for our sins through Christ. Her entry into Heaven prefigures our own hope of experiencing the same eternal life.





Cardinal's Message to the Archdiocese of Boston

Dear Friends,

On Monday, August 5, 2024 the Holy Father announced that he has named the Most Reverend Richard G. Henning, S.T.D. as the tenth bishop and seventh archbishop of the Archdiocese of Boston. Archbishop-elect Henning is currently the Bishop of the Diocese of Providence.

On behalf of the entire Archdiocese of Boston, including our priests, religious, deacons, and laity we welcome Archbishop -elect Richard Henning. We extend our deep gratitude to the Holy Father for this appointment demonstrating his ongoing pastoral care for the people of the Archdiocese. I look forward to our people and the wider community getting to know our new Archbishop-elect in the days, weeks, months and years ahead. He ministers with the heart of a pastor with a sincere commitment to serving Christ and the Church.

Archbishop-elect Henning will be installed as Archbishop of Boston on Thursday, October 31, 2024, at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston, MA. Additional details to follow.

Archbishop-elect Henning has asked us to share his initial comments with you on his appointment:

"I am grateful to His Holiness Pope Francis for his confidence in me and for his conferral of this new mission as Archbishop of Boston. I receive this appointment relying upon divine Providence, aware that this is the Lord's Church and that I am no more than an unworthy servant.

I would also like to express my gratitude to His Eminence Cardinal Sean O'Malley who has served the Church of Boston for many faithful and joyful years.

Greetings to the clergy and faithful of Boston. I ask your prayers that I may cling to the Lord's Holy Cross, honor His mother, imitate His saints, and love you as His people and His ministers."

Certainly, I have much left to express to you all about my gratitude for my 21 years as your shepherd. I will reserve those words for a time closer to the end of my assignment as your Archbishop. Today is a day of celebration and prayer as we welcome the Holy Father's assignment of Archbishop-elect Henning to the Archdiocese. I ask that you pray for him as he begins to plan for this transition. In the meantime, please be assured of my continued prayers for all of you.


