

PREGUNTA DECISIVA

El evangelio de Juan ha conservado el recuerdo de una fuerte crisis entre los seguidores de Jesús. No tenemos apenas datos. Solo se nos dice que a los discípulos les resulta duro su modo de hablar. Probablemente les parece excesiva la adhesión que reclama de ellos. En un determinado momento, "muchos discípulos se retiraron y ya no iban con él".

Por primera vez experimenta Jesús que sus palabras no tienen la fuerza deseada. Sin embargo, no las retira sino que se reafirma más: "Las

palabras que os he dicho son espíritu y son vida, pero algunos de vosotros no creen". Sus palabras parecen duras, pero transmiten vida, hacen vivir, pues contienen Espíritu de Dios. Jesús no pierde la paz. No le inquieta el fracaso. Dirigiéndose a los Doce les hace la pregunta decisiva: "¿También vosotros queréis marcharos?". No los quiere retener por la fuerza. Les deja la libertad de decidir. Sus discípulos no han de ser siervos sino amigos. Si quieren puede volver a sus casas.

Una vez más Pedro responde en nombre de todos. Su respuesta es ejemplar. Sincera, humilde, sensata, propia de un discípulo que conoce a Jesús lo suficiente como para no abandonarlo. Su actitud puede todavía hoy ayudar a quienes con fe vacilante se plantean prescindir de toda fe. "Señor, ¿a quién iríamos?". No tiene sentido abandonar a Jesús de cualquier manera, sin haber encontrado un maestro mejor y más convincente: Si no siguen a Jesús se quedarán sin saber a quién seguir. No se han de precipitar. No es bueno quedarse sin luz ni guía en la vida.

Pedro es realista. ¿Es bueno abandonar a Jesús sin haber encontrado una esperanza más convincente y atractiva? ¿Basta sustituirlo por un estilo de vida rebajada, sin apenas metas ni horizonte? ¿Es mejor vivir sin preguntas, planteamientos ni búsqueda de ninguna clase? Hay algo que Pedro no olvida: "Tús palabras dan vida eterna". Siente que las palabras de Jesús no son palabras vacías ni engañosas. Junto a él han descubierto la vida de otra manera. Su mensaje les ha abierto a la vida eterna. ¿Dónde podrían encontrar una noticia mejor de Dios?

Pedro recuerda, por último, la experiencia fundamental. Al convivir con Jesús han descubierto que viene del misterio de Dios. Desde lejos, a distancia, desde la indiferencia o el desinterés no se puede reconocer el misterio que se encierra en Jesús. Los Doce lo han tratado de cerca. Por eso pueden decir: "Nosotros creemos y sabemos que tú eres el Santo de Dios". Seguirán junto a Jesús.

August 25 ~ Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel points out that even some who had personally accompanied Jesus found his teaching too hard, and returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Even today, we see people give up or step away from the demands of being a follower of Christ stating that their faith no longer feels relevant or is too demanding. We too may be tempted to question the teaching of Jesus or feel it takes too much effort and want to walk away. Jesus puts the question to us today that he posed to the disciples, "Do you also want to leave?" Hopefully our response will be like that of Peter, and we will say, "Lord, to who shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Take time this week with Jesus' question and ask for the grace of perseverance in following him.

Saint Monica

FEAST DAY: AUGUST 27

orn in Tagaste in present-day Algeria, this North African lay woman was given in marriage to Patricius, a Roman pagan. St. Augustine of Hippo, a saint in the making, was their eldest child. Monica tried to bring him up a Christian but was also concerned for his worldly success and sent him to Carthage to study. Her prayers helped the conversion of both her husband and her mother-inlaw to Christ. Her two other children, Navigius and Perpetua, were also known for righteousness, and Perpetua eventually entered religious life. But Augustine, to Monica's dismay, joined the heretical Manichean sect. He scorned Christianity and had a son with his mistress. In 383, Monica sought his conversion and followed Augustine to Italy, where she became a follower of St. Ambrose and asked for his intervention with Augustine. Three years later, Augustine was baptized by St. Ambrose. Monica fell ill shortly after and died before their return to Africa. Years before, a bishop had famously counseled her, "It is not possible that the son of so many tears should be lost."





But it was Peter who voiced their loyalty and faith: we are convinced you are God's holy one. They may not have fully understood, but they knew Jesus was the real deal.

Discipleship is about loyalty and faithfulness. It is about perseverance and persistence. We are not fair-weather believers, nor are we easily distracted from our work. We have seen what the Lord can do and we take Him at His word. Do not worry about tough times or difficult moments. We play on a winning team!
