



Join us for this year's YB Catholic Conference as we host Roy Schoeman, Catholic speaker and author. Roy was born and raised Jewish by Jewish parents who had fled Nazi Germany. Growing up he received a thorough Jewish education, followed by a Bachelor of Science degree from MIT, and an M.B.A. magna cum laude from Harvard Business School, where he then joined the faculty as a professor of marketing.

While at Harvard Business School, he received two supernatural experiences- one of Christ and one of the Blessed Virgin Mary- that resulted in his unanticipated and enthusiastic conversion to Catholicism. Now he writes, speaks, and teaches on Catholic theology, focusing on the relationship between Judaism and the Catholic Church.

He has written two best-selling books published by Ignatius Press - Salvation is from the Jews: The Role of Judaism in Salvation History, and Honey from the Rock: Sixteen Jews Find the Sweetness of Christ, taught theology at Ave Maria University and Holy Apostles College and Seminary,, and appears frequently on EWTN television and radio shows, including "EWTN Live", "The Journey Home", "Bookmark", and "Women of Grace", and gives talks, missions, and retreats throughout the US, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Europe, and South and Central America.

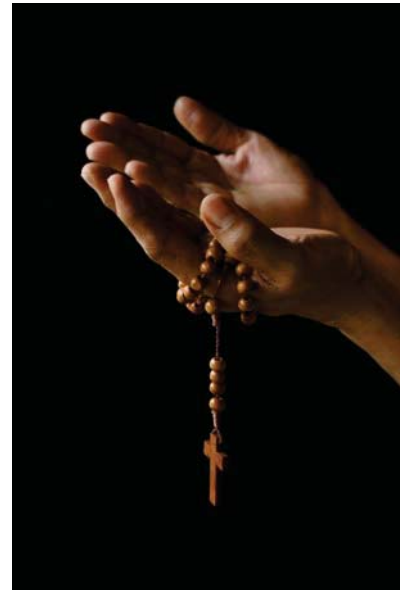

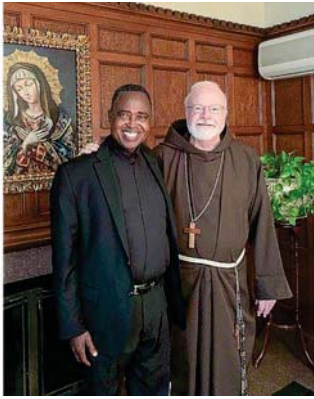

October 13 ~ Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The rich young man in today's gospel is like many of us. He knows about his faith and its teachings but was challenged when Jesus posed the idea of giving his possessions and money to the poor. That was more than he was willing to do and so he went away sad. When we hear Jesus say "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." Will we respond with generosity as Jesus urges, or will we turn away unwilling to give up our possessions? What will we do? Let us pray for an open and generous spirit in our response to Christ's invitation.



Una observación preliminar es necesaria para despejar el terreno de posibles equívocos al leer lo que el Evangelio de este domingo dice de la riqueza. Jesús jamás condena la riqueza ni los bienes terrenos por sí mismos. Entre sus amigos está también José de Arimatea, «hombre rico»; Zaqueo es declarado «salvado», aunque retenga para sí la mitad de sus bienes, que, visto el oficio de recaudador de impuestos que desempeñaba, debían ser considerables. Lo que condena es el apegamiento exagerado al dinero y a los bienes, hacer depender de ellos la propia vida y acumular tesoros sólo para uno (Lc 12, 13-21).

La Palabra de Dios llama al apegamiento excesivo al dinero «idolatría» (Col 3, 5; Ef 5, 5). El dinero no es uno de tantos ídolos; es el ídolo por antonomasia. Literalmente «dios de fundición» (Ex 34, 17). Es el anti-dios porque crea una especie de mundo alternativo, cambia el objeto a las virtudes teologales. Fe, esperanza y caridad ya no se ponen en Dios, sino en el dinero. Se realiza una siniestra inversión de todos los valores. «Nada es imposible para Dios», dice la Escritura, y también: «Todo es posible para quien cree». Pero el mundo dice: «Todo es posible para quien tiene dinero».

La avaricia, además de la idolatría, es asimismo fuente de infelicidad. El avaro es un hombre infeliz. Desconfiado de todos, se aísla. No tiene afectos, ni siquiera entre los de su misma carne, a quienes ve siempre como aprovechados y quienes, a su vez, alimentan con frecuencia respecto a él un solo deseo de verdad: que muera pronto para heredar sus riquezas. Tenso hasta el espasmo para ahorrar, se niega todo en la vida y así no disfruta ni de este mundo ni de Dios, pues sus renunciaciones no se hacen por Él. En vez de obtener seguridad y tranquilidad, es un eterno rehén de su dinero.

Pero Jesús no deja a nadie sin esperanza de salvación, tampoco al rico. Cuando los discípulos, después de lo dicho sobre el camello y el ojo de la aguja, preocupados le preguntaron a Jesús: «Entonces ¿quién podrá salvarse?», Él respondió: «Para los hombres, imposible; pero no para Dios». Dios puede salvar también al rico. La cuestión no es «si el rico se salva» (esto no ha estado jamás en discusión en la tradición cristiana), sino «qué rico se salva».

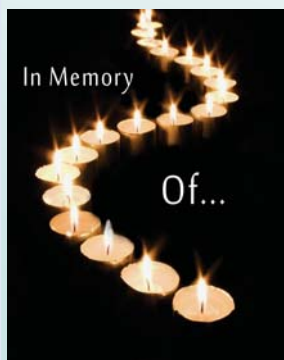
Jesús señala a los ricos una vía de salida de su peligrosa situación: «Acumulaos tesoros en el cielo, donde no hay polilla ni herrumbre que corroan» (Mt 6, 20); «Hacedos amigos con el dinero injusto, para que, cuando llegue a faltar, os reciban en las esternas moradas» (Lc 16, 9). ¿Se diría que Jesús aconseja a los ricos transferir su capital al exterior! Pero no a Suiza, ¡al cielo! Muchos —dice Agustín— se afanan en meter su propio dinero bajo tierra, privándose hasta del placer de verlo, a veces durante toda la vida, con tal de saberlo seguro. ¿Por qué no ponerlo nada menos que en el cielo, donde estaría mucho más seguro y donde se volverá a encontrar, un día, para siempre? ¿Cómo hacerlo? Es sencillo, prosigue San Agustín: Dios te ofrece, en los pobres, a los portadores. Ellos van allí donde tú esperas ir un día. La necesidad de Dios está aquí, en el pobre, y te lo devolverá cuando vayas allí.

Pero está claro que la limosna de calderilla y la beneficencia ya no es hoy el único modo de emplear la riqueza para el bien común, ni probablemente el más recomendable. Existe también el de pagar honestamente los impuestos, crear nuevos puestos de trabajo, dar un salario más generoso a los trabajadores cuando la situación lo permita, poner en marcha empresas locales en los países en vías de desarrollo. En resumen, poner a rendir el dinero, hacerlo fluir. Ser canales que hacen circular el agua, no lagos artificiales que la retienen sólo para sí.

Saint Vincent de Paul is a quiet force for good in our community. For over 140 years our conference has addressed the needs of our community working among those who are in need.

Saint Vincent de Paul built a network of missions and confraternities for those in need beginning in the 1600s. His foundation for a global charity system now operates in 142 countries. In America, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul comes to the aid of millions of people. Vincentians hail from all walks of life and work for a noble purpose: in addressing the needs of the poor both spiritually and materially, they see the face of Christ.

Father John Williams brought the Conference of St. Vincent de Paul to Boston in 1861. The Society flourished over the city when Fr. Williams became bishop. Charlestown had the benefit of three conferences, one for every church. Each group was operated by dedicated laypersons and relied upon the donations of parishioners. St. Mary’s Conference—which runs in our parish today—began in 1876 under the auspices of Msgr. McMahon. Through the donations received they were able to supply shoes for children and offer food to the unemployed.

Vincentians respond to a variety of issues throughout Charlestown every week. Some need help with rent, utilities, and furniture. Society members engage by listening to their stories, determining their living and assisting in whatever way they can.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society also has a furniture warehouse in Stoughton where new beds are purchased. Financial donations from our parishioners allow our local Conference to buy the beds and have them delivered to our neighbors in need. Our conference also accepts gently used furniture that is in good condition such as couches or love seats and/or table and chairs. Without donations to the St. Mary Conference of the Society, this assistance would not be possible. Please prayerfully consider placing a donation in one of our SVdP collection boxes found in back of the Church, or sending a donation earmarked for St. Vincent de Paul, to our Parish Center at 46 Winthrop Street.

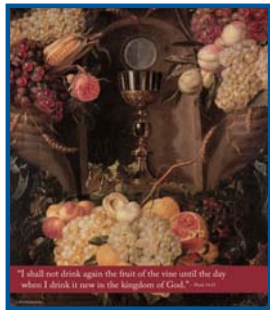

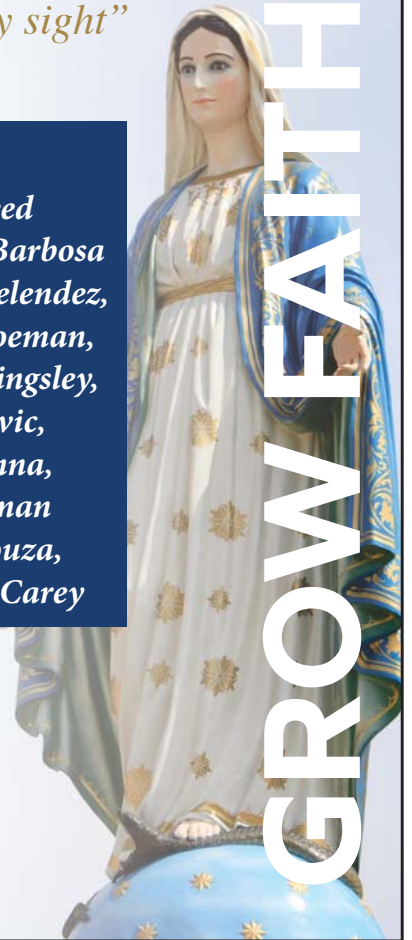
