
St. Mary's Church is handicapped-accessible on Soley Street. St. Catherine's Chapel is handicapped-accessible on Winthrop Street.





October 20 ~ Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel gives us a glimpse at real life among the disciples, ordinary people jockeying for places of honor in the kingdom of God. Jesus quickly points out that being his follower isn't about achieving notoriety or special treatment, rather it is all about being a servant to others. We know that the kind of service Jesus asks for cost him his life! Are we willing to accept the cost of being his disciple, by loving and serving those who are called unlovable or undeserving? Doing so won't win us honor or privilege in this world, but it will bring us life in the next!



Mientras suben a Jerusalén, Jesús va anunciando a sus discípulos el destino doloroso que le espera en la capital. Los discípulos no le entienden. Andan disputando entre ellos por los primeros puestos. Santiago y Juan, discípulos de primera hora, se acercan a él para pedirle directamente sentarse un día "el uno a tu derecha y el otro a tu izquierda". A Jesús se le ve desalentado: "No sabéis lo que pedís". Nadie en el grupo parece entender que seguirlo de cerca colaborando en su proyecto, siempre será un camino no de poder y grandezas, sino de sacrificio y cruz.

Mientras tanto, al enterarse del atrevimiento de Santiago y Juan, los otros diez se indignan. El grupo está más agitado que nunca. La ambición los está dividiendo. Jesús los reúne


a todos para dejar claro su pensamiento. Antes que nada, les expone lo que sucede en los pueblos del Imperio romano. Todos conocen los abusos de Antipas y las familias herodianas en Galilea. Jesús lo resume así: Los que son reconocidos como jefes utilizan su poder para "tiranizar" a los pueblos, y los grandes no hacen sino "oprimir" a sus súbditos. Jesús no puede ser más tajante: "Vosotros, nada de eso".

No quiere ver entre los suyos nada parecido: "El que quiera ser grande entre vosotros que sea vuestro servidor, y el que quiera ser primero entre vosotros que sea esclavo de todos". En su comunidad no habrá lugar para el poder que oprime, solo para el servicio que ayuda. Jesús no quiere jefes sentados a su derecha e izquierda, sino servidores como él, que dan su vidapor los demás. Jesús deja las cosas claras. Su Iglesia no se construye desde la imposición de los de arriba, sino desde el servicio de los que se colocan abajo. No cabe en ella jerarquía alguna en clave de honor o dominación. Tampoco métodos y estrategias de poder. Es el servicio el que construye la Iglesia de Jesús.

Jesús da tanta importancia a lo que está diciendo que se pone a sí mismo como ejemplo, pues no ha venido al mundo para exigir que le sirvan, sino "para servir y dar su vida en rescate por todos". Jesús no enseña a nadie a triunfar en la Iglesia sino a servir al proyecto del reino de Dios desviviéndonos por los más débiles y necesitados. La enseñanza de Jesús no es solo para los dirigentes. Desde tareas y responsabilidades diferentes, hemos de comprometernos todos a vivir con más entrega al servicio de su proyecto. No necesitamos en la Iglesia imitadores de Santiago y Juan, sino seguidores fieles de Jesús. Los que quieran ser importantes, que se pongan a trabajar y colaborar.

IN PRAYERFUL THANKSGIVING FOR HIS SERVICE AND LEADERSHIP



Cardinal Seán Patrick O'Malley, OFM Cap. DATE OF ORDINATION: AUGUST 29, 1970

Cardinal Seán Patrick O'Malley, OFM Cap. is the ninth bishop and sixth archbishop in the 200+ year history of the Archdiocese of Boston.

He was born in Lakewood, Ohio, June 29, 1944, son of the late Theodore and Mary Louise (Reidy) O'Malley. He attended St. Gabriel and Sacred Heart Elementary Schools in Pennsylvania and St. Fidelis High School, a high school seminary conducted by the Capuchin fathers, in Butler, Pa.

He prepared for the priesthood at St. Fidelis Seminary, also in Butler, and at the Capuchin College in Washington, D.C. He was professed on July 14, 1965 in the Capuchin Order, a religious order dedicated to following in the tradition of St. Francis of Assisi.

On Aug. 29, 1970, Pittsburgh's Auxiliary Bishop John B. McDowell ordained him a priest of the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin. He then went on to earn a master's degree in religious education and a doctorate in Spanish and Portuguese Literature, both at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., where he also taught from 1969 to 1973.

In 1973 he began serving as Executive Director of El Centro Catolico Hispano in the Washington Archdiocese before being named Episcopal Vicar for the Hispanic, Portuguese and Haitian communities and executive director of the archdiocesan Office of Social Ministry in 1978. Here he developed a strong commitment to the issues of social justice and new immigrants.

Pope John Paul II appointed him as coadjutor bishop of the Diocese of St. Thomas in the Virgin Islands on May 30, 1984. He was ordained a bishop on Aug. 2, 1984 at the Cathedral of Sts. Peter and Paul in St. Thomas, V.I. He became the diocesan bishop of the Caribbean diocese, succeeding Bishop Harper, on Oct. 16, 1985.

On June 16, 1992 Pope John Paul II announced the appointment of Bishop O'Malley as the sixth bishop of Fall River.

During his 10 years in Fall River, he was involved with the wider community both within the diocese itself and in the Commonwealth. He was active in the work of the Massachusetts Catholic Conference, especially on pro-life issues. While Bishop of Fall River, he was appointed by Pope John Paul II to the Special Assembly for Oceania of the Synod of Bishops. He has also served as Apostolic Visitator for several seminaries in Central America and the Caribbean.

On Sept. 3, 2002, Pope John Paul II named him to be the fourth Bishop of the Diocese of Palm Beach, Fla., which had seen its previous bishop resign six months earlier after admitting to abuse of minors. After less than a year in Palm Beach, on July 1, 2003, Pope John Paul II appointed him the Archbishop of Boston.

Pope Benedict XVI elevated him to cardinal on March 24, 2006 and gave him the titular church of Santa Maria della Vittoria. The Holy Father also named him a member of the Congregation for the Clergy and the Congregation for the Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life.

During a trip to Rome in September 2006, Cardinal O'Malley became the first cardinal in the world to launch a personal blog, cardinalseansblog.org, which he updates weekly.

In the late 2000's, with the immediate effects of the clergy abuse crisis in Boston largely passed, Cardinal O'Malley turned his attention to the long-term spiritual and fiscal health of the archdiocese. He implemented plans to conserve parish resources, launched the Campaign for Catholic Schools aimed at strengthening and expanding the existing schools, and stabilized the archdiocese's lay-employee and clergy pension systems as well as the clergy health and retirement funds.

He has also put a great emphasis on vocations and outreach of the Church to youth, including expanding the archdiocese's use of the Internet and social media and encouraging participation in pilgrimages to the International World Youth Days and the annual March for Life in Washington, D.C.

Shortly after Pope Francis's March 2013 election, the Holy Father selected Cardinal O'Malley to be the only North American member of his council of cardinals — commonly called the "group of nine" or simply the "G9" — who advise the Holy Father on the restructuring of the Roman Curia. Pope Francis has also asked him to lead the Vatican's Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors, which held its first meeting in May 2014.

Cardinal O'Malley has been an active member of the United States Catholic Conference of Catholic Bishops and is the former chairman of their Committee Pro-Life Activities. Previously, he headed the Commission on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations. He is also a member of the USCCB Administrative Board, the committees on Migration and Pro-Life Activities and the subcommittees on the Church in Africa and the Church in Latin America.

Throughout his years as bishop, Cardinal O'Malley has served on numerous other commissions and committees, including Missions (of which he was chairman), Priestly Formation, Hispanic Affairs, Migration, as well as serving on the board of directors for Catholic Relief Services, the Association for the Development of the Catholic University of Portugal and on the board of trustees of his alma mater, The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

Saint John Paul II

hen this popular pope died, crowds in St. Peter's Square chanted "santo subito" ("sainthood now"). The Vatican heard, and the sainthood cause for the jet setting pontiff who helped bring down European communism was put on the fast track; he was beatified in 2011. A strong admirer of St. Faustina and her dedication to Divine Mercy, John Paul II was canonized on Divine Mercy Sunday 2014 by Pope Francis.

A Pole and former actor shaped by World War II and the Cold War, Cardinal Karol Wojtyla of Krakow (John Paul II) was the first non-Italian pope in 455 years. In his 26-year pontificate, he evangelized on trips to 129 countries, upheld traditional church doctrine against dissent, connected with the world's youth, established World Youth Day, and named more than 450 new saints. He also modeled Christian values by forgiving his would-be assassin and living an increasingly frail old age in public.

John Paul II established Divine Mercy Sunday as the Second Sunday of Easter for the Church in April 2000, though the feast had already been celebrated in Poland for many years. In that first Divine Mercy Sunday Mass, John Paul II said it was Jesus' love and mercy that must inspire all of humanity:

Thus the message of divine mercy is also implicitly a message about the value of every human being. 
