

What is a Collaborative Pastoral Council?

A Pastoral Council fosters full participation of the entire parish – clergy, religious, laity – in the pastoral life and mission of the parishes, the collaborative and the Church.

These principles guide the formation of Pastoral Councils:

Every Pastoral Council is to develop a statement of purpose which reflects the identity and mission of the parish in light of the Gospel, Church teachings and the specific realities of the collaborative.

It is a consultative body which advises and assists the Pastor in areas of pastoral concerns.

It develops and recommends pastoral plans and directions through a consensus process and prayerful reflection.

Every Council in its membership should be representative of the collaborative, recognizing and reflecting its rich diversity.

It cooperates with committees which address such areas as worship, spirituality, community, evangelization, education, and service.

It is the responsibility of the Pastor to convoke the Council, to preside over it, and to determine the issues to be treated by it or to receive proposals from its members.

In the event that the Pastor of a parish dies, resigns or is transferred, the Council ceases to exist. It is the prerogative of a newly appointed Pastor to either confirm the present membership of the former Council or choose to have new members elected, with the exception of the three members who serve on this council ex officio and the three members the Pastor is to appoint.

Function of the Pastoral Council

The general function of the Pastoral Council is to advise the Pastor in those pastoral matters presented to it by the Pastor. It carries out its function by:

Informing the Pastor of the needs and concerns, gifts and resources of the collaborative and its members.

Developing and reviewing a Mission Statement and periodically re-evaluating and revising it.

Developing a pastoral plan.

Participating in ongoing pastoral planning.

Recommending policies, procedures and programs which would assist in the application of the Mission Statement and the pastoral plan.

Reviewing and evaluating the effectiveness of existing programs.

Reflecting on Archdiocesan pastoral priorities and recommending how they can be implemented in the collaborative.

Soon, we will be announcing nominations and elections for our Collaborative Pastoral Council.

Feb. 11th - Our Lady of Lourdes

is a Roman Catholic title of the Blessed Virgin Mary venerated in honor of the Marian apparitions that reportedly occurred in the vicinity of Lourdes in

France. The first of these is the apparition of 11 Feb. 1858, when 14-year old Bernadette Soubirous told her mother that a "lady" spoke to her in the cave of Massabielle (a kilometer and a half (1 mi) from the town) while she was gathering firewood with her sister and a friend. Similar apparitions of the "Lady" were reported on seventeen occasions that year, until the climax revelation of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception took place.

She said the apparition asked her to dig in the ground and drink from the spring she found there. This made her disheveled and some of her supporters were dismayed, but this act revealed the stream that soon became a focal point for pilgrimages. Although it was muddy at first, the stream became increasingly clean. As word spread, this water was given to medical patients of all kinds, and many reports of miraculous cures followed. Seven of these cures were confirmed as lacking any medical explanations by Professor Verges in 1860. The first person with a "certified miracle" was a woman whose right hand had been deformed as a consequence of an accident

In 18 Jan. 1862, Pope Pius IX authorized Bishop Bertrand-Sévère Laurence to permit the veneration of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Lourdes. On 3 July 1876, the same Pontiff officially granted a Canonical Coronation to the image that used to be in the courtyard of what is now part of the Rosary Basilica. The image of Our Lady of Lourdes has been widely copied and reproduced in shrines and homes, often in garden landscapes. Soubirous was later canonized as a Catholic saint.

St. Mary Church Trivia

The Stations of the Cross and altar statues in our Church were designed by the noted ecclesiastical sculptor Joseph Sibbel (1850-1907). An identical set of stations was built by Sibbel for the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Connecticut, but this was lost when the building burned down in 1956. It was said that Sibbel's face is carved into a chair within a station somewhere in our Church. Can you find it?

FEAST DAY February 14 – Saint Valentine

Legend has it that this famous saint, an Italian doctor who later became a priest, inspired the creation of the holiday of Valentine's Day. He was sent to jail for performing weddings for couples during a time when new marriages were out-

lawed in ancient Rome. Emperor Claudius II outlawed marriage while trying to build up his army, fearing it was an obstacle to recruiting men and a distracation to those already in the army.

Before he was killed for refusing to renounce his faith, he sent a loving note to a child he had been helping to teach, the daughter of his jailer, who was blind and whose sight was healed after receiving the letter so that she could read it herself. That note eventually led to the tradition of sending Valentine's cards.

February 14th is World Marriage Day!

On this World Marriage Day, we thank our heavenly Father for the gift and blessing of marriage and the family. As we strive to live our particular vocations and respond to the Lord's grace in our lives, let's also consider how we might dedicate renewed prayer and attention to marriage and the family.

As a start, here are possible areas we might consider:

First, we begin with prayer: Let's remember to pray with and for marriages and families throughout our nation: for marriages in crisis, for families struggling with unemployment, for broken or wounded family relationships.

Second, let us reclaim Sunday as the Lord's Day, a day of rest when we can focus on being together as a family. The celebration of Holy Mass together is the first essential way to honor this day. But is there something more the Lord is inviting us to when we go back home? Set aside some time to pray a decade of the rosary, enjoy the outdoors together, play ball, eat dinner together, have a game night!

And third, let us remember that the Church is the family of God and a family of families. As a family, how can we share Christ with other married couples and families? Do we have any friends and family members who are struggling in their marriage, alone during this time of isolation, or particularly afflicted by this pandemic? When was the last time we checked on our elderly neighbors? Is there someone in the parish that we haven't seen in a while? How can we—as a family—reach out to those who are in need?

February 9 ~ Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus invites the disciples who have been fishing all night to "put out into the deep. . ." Despite their fatigue, they do as Jesus asks because they have faith in him. They are rewarded with a large catch of fish and are then instructed to become fishers of men (and women). That instruction wasn't meant just for the twelve, it is meant for each one of us. Where and to whom can you reach out to? Who do you know that needs Christ's healing and love? The grace and ability to be a disciple is there for us, it just takes courage and a listening heart to "put out into the deep."

El contacto con todo lo que es sagrado hace que el corazón se incline hacia lo que es santo.

San Pablo reconoce cómo el encuentro personal con Cristo resucitado le trastocó totalmente su existencia dándole un sentido que elevaba más allá de lo que él mismo podía haber soñado. Del mismo modo que le sucedió a Isaías, el propio Pablo en ese encuentro con Jesucristo siente cómo es sanado interiormente y el gozo se hace presente en su existencia. Es como si uno tuviese una ventana en su dormitorio con unas vistas preciosas y una claridad envidiable; y de repente alguien levantase un muro de hormigón a medio metro de la ventana dejándote la habitación a oscuras aunque el sol estuviese en lo más alto de su esplendor. Ese muro levantado de hormigón es el pecado que impide que los rayos solares de la gracia de Dios entren en la persona. Pues EL ENCUENTRO PERSONAL CON CRISTO RESUCITADO AYUDA A RECONOCER LA EXISTENCIA DE ESE MURO, porque todos lo tenemos, otra cosa es que nos hayamos percatado de su existencia. Y lo mejor de todo esto es que cuando uno reconoce que tiene ese muro desea derribarlo porque no desea verse privado, ni un segundo más, de la compañía de Dios en su vida. Simón Pedro es otro ejemplo precioso de cómo cuando uno conoce a Cristo y reconoce que Cristo sana amando intensamente, uno se rinde sin condiciones porque desea dar gracias a Dios de todo corazón con sus pensamientos, obras y palabras. Jesucristo quiere salir a tu encuentro; no te ocultes ante su presencia. Así sea.

World Day of Prayer, Reflection, and Action Against Human Trafficking

The Feast Day of Saint Josephine Bakhita

On this day, we remember and pray for survivors and victims of modern-day slavery. We pray that we may work together to remove the causes of this disgraceful scourge that is present in all our cities and neighborhoods. This day is also one of awareness and action: our prayers are strengthened three-fold when we accompany them with a willingness to become aware of the problem and become involved in erasing this evil.

February 8th is also the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita. Born in the Darfur region of Sudan in 1869, St. Bakhita was kidnapped and enslaved as a child. Eventually she was sold to an Italian diplomat and taken to Italy, where she valiantly asserted her freedom with the help of the Cannossian Sisters of Venice. Through her faith, St. Bakhita realized the promise of liberty inherent in the human spirit. She lived out the rest of her life as a Cannossian sister, sharing her empowering testimony of human freedom and dignity. In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Josephine Bakhita, noting that in this saint, "we find a shining advocate of genuine emancipation."






