

FASTING ON ASH WEDNESDAY AND IN LENT

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) years of age and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics who are eighteen (18) years of age but not yet fiftynine (59) years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.

March 2 ~ Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel offers much ponder as we move toward the start of Lent. First Jesus says, "Remove the wooden beam from your eye first, then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's [sister's] eye." Then he says, "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit." Both sayings remind us of our need to reflect on our personal blind spots, behaviors or attitudes that demean others rather than build up others. If we take time to thoughtfully consider Jesus' teaching in this gospel, we may realize our need for God's healing in the Sacrament of Penance, especially before Lent starts. With God's grace and our effort to remove the "wooden beam in our own eye" will lead to our bearing "good fruit" during our Lenten journey!

What is an indulgence?

An indulgence remits the temporal punishment of sin already forgiven. Sorrow for sin can lead to repentance and forgiveness, but the disruption of God's order and the effect of the sin on others remains. For the sake of justice, there must be a mitigation of the evil effects of the sin; an attempt to "make up" for the evil caused. Temporal punishment is a consequence of the sin which helps to purify our souls and restore, as possible, God's order. An indulgence, indulges us. It provides for our spiritual purification without pain or difficulty because the merits of Christ's death and those of the saints are applied on our behalf. 



The month of March is dedicated to St. Joseph. We don't know much about him except what is mentioned in the Gospels. Joseph was the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. Holy Scripture proclaims him as a "just man," Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical *Quamquam Pluries (On the Devotion to St. Joseph)* in 1889 explains why we place so much trust in this saint:

"Thus in giving Joseph the Blessed Virgin as spouse, God appointed him to be not only her life's companion, the witness of her maidenhood, the protector of her honor, but also, by virtue of the conjugal tie, a participator in her sublime dignity. And Joseph shines among all mankind by the most august dignity, since by divine will, he was the guardian of the Son of God and reputed as His father among men. Hence it came about that the Word of God was humbly subject to Joseph, that He obeyed him, and that He rendered to him all those offices that children are bound to render to their parents."



Shrove Tuesday: Fat Tuesday: March 4


Shrove Tuesday, is the day immediately preceding Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent in Western Christian churches. It is also known as Fat Tuesday. Traditionally, Catholics have embraced Fat Tuesday as a way to get rid of all the fats and desserts in the house in preparation for Lent.

The deeper meaning for Fat Tuesday actually comes from its traditional name, Shrove Tuesday. The word "shrove" means to give absolution—to be forgiven! Shrove Tuesday is an invi-

tation to reflect on your life, seek forgiveness and peace, and get ready for 40 days of spiritual renewal during Lent.

Pancakes are the traditional choice in a number of European countries; the day is known as Pancake Day or Pancake Tuesday in Ireland. In Poland, Paczki (deep fried doughnuts) are traditional.

Mardi Gras-which means "Fat Tuesday" in French is a well known celebration that takes place in New Orleans, where parades, parties, and feasting lasts anywhere from one day to several weeks. King Cake is the special food for the day,



WHY ASHES

For centuries, Catholic Christians have marked the beginning of the season of Lent by receiving ashes on their foreheads on Ash Wednesday. This tradition has its roots in the Old Testament, where wearing ashes was a common sign of repentance for sins, and a sign of one's humility before God. Since Lent is a season of penitential renewal through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, it's appropriate that this ancient sign marks the beginning of the season.

The ashes themselves are usually made by burning the palm fronds from the previous year's Palm Sunday. This symbolically connects the beginning of Lent with its end, connecting our change of heart with Christ's passion, death, and resurrection.

Ashes are usually distributed as part of the Mass on Ash Wednesday, often after the homily. As people approach the priest or other minister, he presses the ashes to their foreheads, and speaks one of two phrases: "remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return", or "Repent and believe in the Gospel".


