

Here's a quick update from Sunday's Youth Group.

After receiving positive feedback and grateful acknowledgement on their Valentine's Day card-making service project for young patients recovering at Spaulding Rehab in Charlestown, the group turned its focus to Lent. The group discussed how Lent represents a period of prayer, fasting and giving. They had a great discussion about what it means to give something up to make room for God. They also learned about the 40 days of Lent and what Jesus did during those 40 days. Everyone shared ideas and suggestions about things that they can "take up" or "give up" for Lent.

CONFRIMATION UPDATE

Here are a couple of updates from Sunday's Confirmation 1 & 2 classes.

Confirmation 1 began a two-part discussion on the Church, including a review of the first Christians and the early Church. The class also discussed the 4 distinct characteristics of the Catholic Church (One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic) and discovered the meaning of each quality and why these 4 qualities matter. More discussion on the Church and the topic of "Why Be Catholic" at the next class on March 16th.

Confirmation 2 students continued their discussion on the Holy Spirit (Part 2) and explored the question What Does the Holy Spirit Do for Me? They had a good conversation about what makes Catholicism unique. Father John joined the class and helped lead the discussion on the 4 marks of the Church. Class ended with a quiet reflection on the Gospel and how it can inspire us during Lent. Saint Reports have been completed and Letters of Intent are in the process of being finalized and submitted by the next class on Sunday, March 16th. Sponsor names are also due by the next class. Sponsor forms were handed out at Sunday's class and a copy of the form is attached to this email. The students continue to make great progress as they move closer to achieving the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday, May 10th.



March 9 ~ First Sunday of Lent

It is significant that on this First Sunday of Lent we hear of the temptations of Jesus. They are often interpreted as representing the broader human struggles we have with desires of the flesh, the desire for signs and proofs, and the lure of worldly power and success. Those desires have a way of creeping into our lives and damaging our relationship both with God and those we love. Lent gives us the opportunity to reorder our lives, to step away from those things that alienate us from God and to focus our attention on the essentials of our faith. St. Paul challenges us today: "if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." This Lent, take time at the end of each day to consider where temptations might have arisen but where instead, you relied on the power of God's grace to guide you.

Jubilee Year 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

How can we gain indulgences by participating in the Jubilee Year if all the doors are in Rome?

To receive an indulgence, we must do the action required, confess our sins and be detached from all sin, receive the Eucharist in Mass, and pray for the pope's intentions (within twenty days). The actions to receive a jubilee indulgence require visiting a pilgrimage site and attending a liturgy, do a penitential practice, or perform a spiritual or corporeal work of mercy. Este año, las únicas puertas santas están en Roma. Pasar por una "puerta santa" ha sido tradicionalmente un signo de conversión, el paso de la antigua vida a una vida de celo y fe renovados. Para recibir una indulgencia, debemos, además de las acciones requeridas por este año jubilar, cumplir los siguientes requisitos: confesarnos (dentro de los veinte días siguientes a la acción requerida), y despojarnos de todo afecto al pecado, recibir la Eucaristía en la Misa y rezar por las intenciones del Papa. Para recibir una indulgencia jubilar, es necesario visitar un lugar de peregrinación y participar en una liturgia, realizar una práctica penitencial o llevar a cabo una obra de misericordia, ya sea espiritual o corporal. 


