

Saint Patrick

he patron saint of Ireland, Patrick was born in Roman Britain. He describes his life and ministry, including his work to convert the Irish people, in his short autobiography and testimony, Confess-ions. Kidnapped at age 16 by Irish raiders and sold into slavery in Ireland, his time spent in captivity transformed him spiritually. He was a lonely shepherd for six years before escaping and returning home.

After returning home, his dream of converting the Irish from pagan belief propelled him to priestly studies in Gaul (now France). In about 432, Pope Celestine I consecrated him as a bishop and sent him to Ireland. For nearly 30 years, he preached tirelessly, made countless converts, founded monasteries, and established the primatial see at Armagh in modern-day Northern Ireland.

Toward the end of his life, he made a 40-day retreat on Croagh Patrick mountain in present-day County Mayo. That gave rise to the pilgrimages that are made on the mountain to this day. Stories that Patrick used the shamrock to explain the Trinity and drove snakes from the island are unconfirmed legend.






Some of these scholarships

March 16 ~ Second Sunday of Lent

In Luke's account of the Transfiguration, Peter and the disciples were overcome with sleep, but "becoming fully awake, they saw his glory" and recognized this as a special moment with Jesus and exclaimed: "Master, it is good that we are here." Our minds are often asleep or distracted, and so we don't see the various ways that Jesus reveals himself to us. Where is Jesus inviting us to notice his presence? Is it in the scripture we have heard or in the Communion we received? Do we see him in those preparing to be baptized at Easter? Do we recognize him in the face of the homeless person we see each day? Look at those around you and hear what God said, not just to the Apostles, but also to each of us: "This is my chosen Son, listen to Him" – notice him and respond!

Jubilee Year 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

What can I do to gain a Jubilee Indulgence?

Visit a pilgrimage site and participate in the liturgy or spend time in adoration; participate in a mission, some spiritual exercises, or a study in the documents of Vatican II or the Catechism of the Catholic Church; perform spiritual or corporeal works of mercy; or penitential practices in keeping with the spirit of the Jubilee. The normal conditions apply. (In addition to one of the above actions, we must also confess our sins and be detached from all sin, receive the Eucharist in Mass, and pray for the pope's intentions within twenty days of performing the above action.) 

GIVING THINGS UP FOR LENT

Ask nearly anyone who grew up Catholic what they're doing for Lent, and they'll probably tell you what they're "giving up" for Lent. The notion of giving up some pleasure for the 40 days of Lent is very much in keeping with the penitential character of the season. Of course, the primary pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. All of these are intended to tum our hearts back to God, to purify us, and prepare us for the celebration of Christ's resurrection at Easter. One of the things that the whole Church gives up for Lent is the acclamation "Alleluia", before the proclamation of the Gospel.

Of course, when it comes to giving things up for Lent, people often get into trouble by taking on too much, or by working from the wrong motivation. To take on too much is to set oneself up for failure. Several years ago, I decided to give up both meat and chocolate for Lent. Instead of turning my heart back to God, this only served to make me

irritable, as every bacon cheeseburger or peanut butter cup I encountered began to take on demonic proportions. The following year, I decided that perhaps the spiritual discipline of Lent was what I needed to help me lose 10 pounds by Easter. This was obviously the wrong motivation, because it made my Lenten practice all about me. This discipline is supposed to get us out of ourselves, and back to God. Needless to say, by Easter I still had those 10 pounds, and felt like a failure besides. The gift of humility comes from all sorts of interesting places.

So this year, I'm trying a different tack. For Lent, I'm giving up complaining. I'm also trying to give up a grudge that I've been quietly carrying around since Christmas. I've also given up elevators, as an occasional reminder of my tendency to take the easy path. Time will tell, but I think I might make it all the way to Easter this year.


