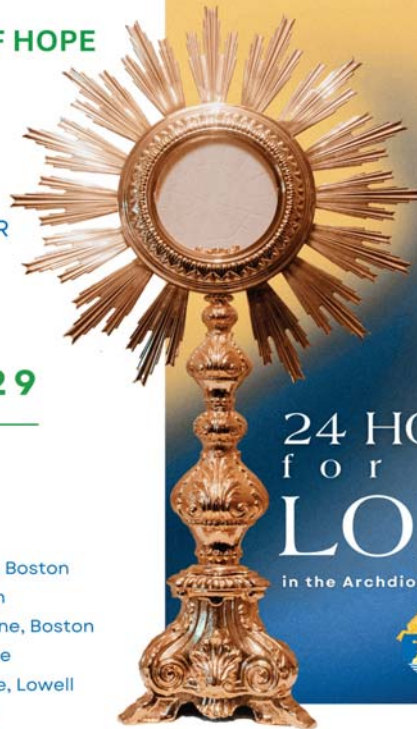

March 23 ~ Third Sunday of Lent

In today's gospel, Jesus is urging the people to repent of their political ambitions and their rebelliousness, warning the Jewish nation that if they kept on seeking the ways of an earthly kingdom and rejecting the ways of the kingdom of God, destruction would come. What about us – are we seeking God's Kingdom? Jesus then tells the parable of the fig tree. God, our gardener, is full of mercy and patience and infinitely kind to anyone who falls and rises again. Actively nurturing and strengthening our discipleship takes effort? If we fall, do we get up and try again or do we just give up? Scriptures give us two witnesses in St. Peter and St. Paul - who had struggles and failures at being disciples, but never gave up. They sought out God's mercy and kept on building God's kingdom. So go ahead, take advantage of the many "second chances" we're being given to grow in our discipleship!

San Oscar Romero

1917 - 1980
DÍA DE FIESTA: 24 DE MARZO

Cuando el monseñor Oscar Romero fue instalado como Arzobispo de San Salvador, El Salvador, en febrero de 1977 tuvo que hacerle frente a una turbulenta situación. Un golpe militar en octubre de 1979 dio como resultado una espantosa guerra civil la cual duró doce años. Estos eventos fueron precipitados por la gran disparidad que había entre un pequeño número de familias ricas y poderosas - quienes estaban respaldadas por los políticos locales y los militares - y el resto de los ciudadanos de El Salvador. Muchas personas sufrieron una pobreza extrema. Los trabajadores recibían un salario mínimo pagado por los ricos terratenientes, sin embargo ellos no tenían la esperanza de adquirir tierras para sí. Los militares sembraban el terror entre la población para asegurarse que las familias mantuvieran sus tierras y su dinero. La Iglesia Católica fue puesta en la mira cuando algunos miembros del clero empezaron a defender a los pobres. Como respuesta a estas injusticias, algunos salvadoreños tomaron las armas y lucharon contra los militares.



Mientras que algunos miembros del clero latinoamericano promovían la violencia como respuesta a las injusticias, el arzobispo Romero proponía utilizar un arma diferente: el amor cristiano.

Antes de ser nombrado arzobispo, el monseñor Romero no se había percatado que el gobierno era el responsable de la muerte de muchos civiles. Debido a su naturaleza tranquila, algunos pensaron que él sería bueno para ocupar ese puesto asumiendo que él no se entrometería en asuntos controvertidos. Sin embargo, poco después de su instalación, un amigo cercano, el padre Rutilio Grande, un sacerdote que estaba abiertamente opuesto a las prácticas injustas de los ricos terratenientes, fue asesinado por unos hombres armados mientras viajaba con dos personas para celebrar una Misa. Esta experiencia hizo que el arzobispo Romero despertara a la realidad de la corrupción en su país y eso lo impulsó a defender la libertad de su pueblo.

El arzobispo Romero predicó muchas homilias que fueron transmitidas en todo San Salvador. Él defendía continuamente los derechos de las personas, haciendo un llamado a los líderes gubernamentales a la conversión y desafiándolos a cumplir con la ley de Dios. Él les recordaba a las personas que Dios las amaba y que defenderse con la caridad cristiana era el camino a la victoria. El uso de su voz para responder a la violencia del gobierno en contra de los pobres lo cual suscitó algunas dificultades con otros miembros del clero y con sus superiores religiosos, así como amenazas de muerte de parte de los cómplices del gobierno. A pesar de estos desafíos, él continuó hablando a favor de los pobres.

El 24 de marzo de 1980, el arzobispo Romero fue asesinado a balazos mientras celebraba la Eucaristía en la capilla del Hospital de la Divina Providencia. El santo Oscar Romero fue beatificado en mayo del 2015 y canonizado por el papa Francisco el 14 de octubre del 2018.

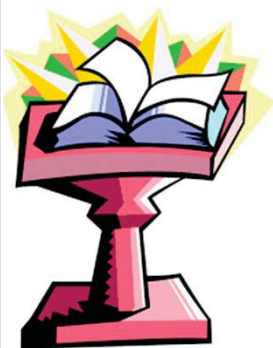


**The Annunciation of the Lord

The group is led by Kathy Devaney with a reflection on Sunday's Gospels. Please come and join us!

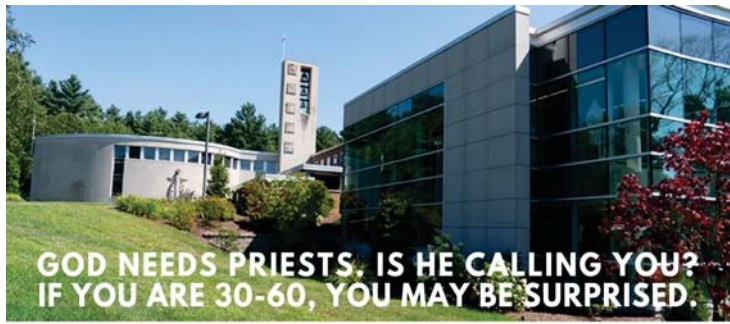

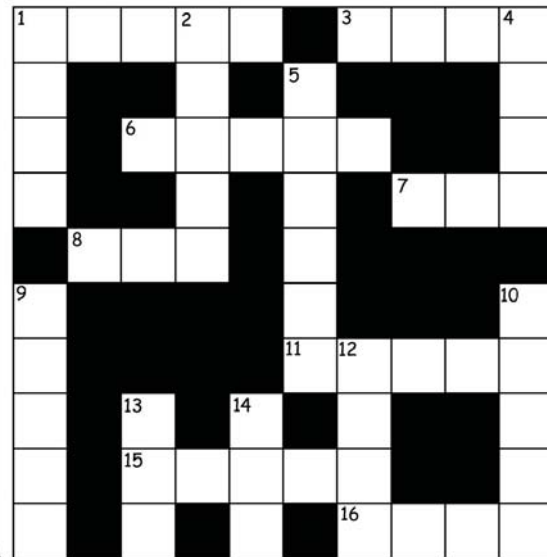

Updates from Sunday's Confirmation 1 & 2 classes:

The Confirmation 1 class completed their two-part review on the Church and focused on the question, Why be Catholic? Afterwards, they engaged in a group discussion on Mission, reading selected passages from the Bible and reviewing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. In small groups, they reflected on questions about mission, mercy, readings from the Bible, and ways to seek their own faith-based missions. During this season of Lent, they reflected on the following words of St. Ignatius: Lord, reach me to be generous. Teach me to serve you as you deserve; to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest, to labor and not to ask for reward, save that of knowing that I do your will. Amen.

Thank you to John, Emily and Abigail for leading a thoughtful and engaging class on these important topics. There are two classes remaining, April 6th & April 13th.

Meanwhile, Confirmation 2 students finished their review on the Church and played several lively rounds of Jeopardy, testing their collective knowledge on the Bible, Prayer, Saints, and the Church. Thank you to Nick for creating the game and making it so fun! Father John joined the class and talked about the significance of Holy Week. He invited them to play a role in Holy Week, particularly Holy Thursday and the ritual of washing the feet, inspired by Jesus' act of humility at the Last Supper.

Saint Reports are complete. Letters of Intent are being finalized and must be submitted no later than our next class on Sunday, April 6th. A helpful guide for the Letters of Intent is attached. Sponsor names and Sponsor Certificates (attached) are also due by our next class. Remember, a sponsor may be a grandparent, aunt, uncle, friend, who has been confirmed in the Catholic faith and who reflects a good example of what it means to be Catholic. Please see attached handouts on Picking a Sponsor and the Sponsor Certificate which requires the sponsor's Pastor to sign the form.

Most students have completed the required two (2) hours of service and had their hours validated by us. For those students who have not completed their service hours, please let us know as soon as possible how you plan on doing your service hours. A copy of your Baptism certificate is also required. Please take a photo of it and email it to me. All completed reports, letters, forms, certificates, and photos can be mailed to me at religiouslystmaryst-catherine@gmail.com. We are quickly approaching the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday, May 10th!

Next classes for Confirmation 1 & 2 is Sunday, April 6th at 7:00 pm, following the 6:00 pm mass.

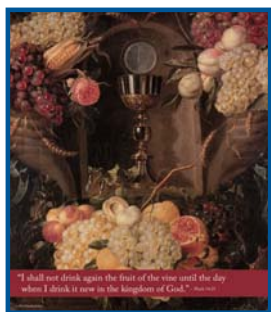
