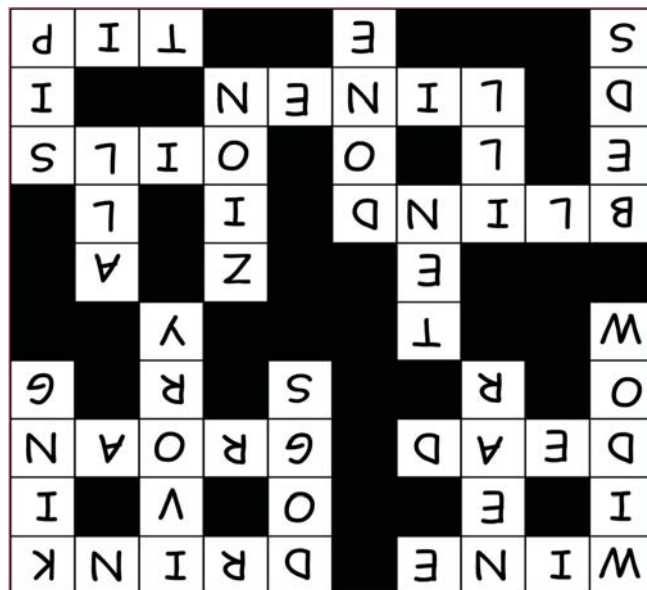
The Hope for Life Conference will be held on Saturday, Oct. 4th at the Track at New Balance in Brighton from 8 AM-4 PM. All are

September 28 ~ Twenty-sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, the rich man showed no compassion or sense of responsibility for Lazarus, the man who was begging at his gate. He remained indifferent to the pain and hunger surrounding him, concerned only with his own comfort and pleasure. This parable challenges us to examine our own worldview: Do we turn a blind eye to those in need, unwilling to accept our responsibility for the poor, the stranger, and those who suffer around us? The rich man realized his responsibility too late! What will it take for us to truly listen to God's word, and respond with compassion and care? Recall Christ's words, "When you did it for one of these least ones. . . you did it for me." Christ awaits our response!

Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels

FEAST DAY: SEPTEMBER 29

These archangels, messengers sent by God, are the only ones named in the Bible. In the Book of Daniel, Michael is called "the great prince"; in the Letter of Jude, he argues with the devil over Moses' body; and in the Book of Revelation, he leads the battle against Satan. He is patron of the sick, radiologists and mariners. Gabriel explains Daniel's visions to him in the Book of Daniel, and in the Gospel of Luke announces to Zechariah and Mary the births of their respective sons. He is the patron of messengers and telecommunications and postal workers. Raphael guides Tobiah in the Book of Tobit; he is patron of the blind, physicians and travelers. The church created their joint feast after the Second Vatican Council.

Él es el patrón de los enfermos, los radiólogos y los marineros. En el Libro de Daniel, Gabriel interpreta las visiones de Daniel y en el Evangelio de Lucas les anuncia a Zacarías y a María el nacimiento de sus respectivos hijos. Él es el patrón de los mensajeros, las telecomunicaciones y los trabajadores postales. En el Libro de Tobías, Rafael le sirve de guía a Tobías. Él es el patrón de los ciegos, los médicos y los viajeros. Después del Concilio Vaticano II, la Iglesia estableció esta fiesta conjunta.
