

Nuestra Señora del Rosario



Esta fiesta celebra la victoria de Dios mediante la intercesión de Nuestra Señora Reina del Rosario. Esta fiesta se formalizó en el siglo XVI.

La fiesta conmemora el día en que las fuer-zas navales de varias naciones cristianas derrotaron a las fuerzas navales invasoras de Turquía en el Golfo de Lepanto, en la costa oeste de Grecia. Para ese entonces, el Rosario era ya una práctica piadosa establecida. Poco antes de esta batalla, el papa Pío V les pidió a los cristianos en toda Europa que rezaran el Rosario por una defensa exitosa y los cristianos en toda Europa y los miem-bros de las tripulaciones navales en más de 200 buques navales, rezaron. Los miembros de la Confraternidad del Rosario también se reunieron en Roma ese día para orar por la victoria de las fuerzas navales.

El domingo 7 de octubre de 1571, se logró una victoria naval contra la flota invasora de los turcos otomanos. El papa Pío V atribuyó la victoria a la intercesión de la Santísima Virgen María mediante las oraciones del Rosario. En 1572, el papa estableció una conmemoración en honor a Nuestra Señora de la Victoria y, en 1573, la fiesta fue cambiada a Nuestra Señora del Rosario, celebrada el primer domingo de octubre. En 1716, el papa extendió esta fiesta a la Iglesia universal y, en 1913, la fiesta se fijó para el 7 de octubre. Tradicionalmente, el mes de octubre es dedicado al Santo Rosario.

Our Confirmation 1 and 2 classes also begin this Sunday.

The Archdiocese has directed that Confirmation takes place in the 8th Grade—instead of 10th—and we are undertaking a 2-year transition to make that happen.

10th grade is the Confirmation II group. 9th grade (Confirmation 1) will meet separately, and grades 7, and 8 will represent a second Confirmation 1 group. All groups will meet monthly.

We will continue to have a two year prep leading to the Sacrament of Confirmation. All classes (including the above youth group) will take place before the 6pm Mass on Sundays.

Confirmation 1 and 2 classes will begin at 4:30 PM at 46 Winthrop Street (Parish Center). This is a change of location from previous years.

Today is Respect Life Sunday! Join Catholics nationwide in celebrating Respect Life Month! respectlife.org/celebrate.



There is perhaps no more beautiful celebration than when parents bring their newborn child to the waters of baptism. Parents, godparents, family, and friends share in this sacrament with incomparable joy. For in baptism, we share in Christ's death and resurrection, and through the outward signs of water and oil, are made children of God and given the hope of eternal life with Him.

"The death and resurrection of Jesus is the heart of our faith and the basis of our hope."1 Through our Lord Jesus Christ, our sins are forgiven, death is overcome, and life is victorious. "Hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite not knowing what the future may bring."2 Because of this Christian hope, we can face the unknown trials of life with faith rather than fear.

We are called to be signs of hope to all people, especially those whose goodness, value, and dignity are undermined. As members of the Body of Christ, we carry this hope with us as we continue Jesus' mission on earth. Pope Leo XIV encourages us, "How important it is that each and every baptized person feel himself or herself called by God to be a sign of hope in the world today."3

Sadly, there is a devastating absence of hope today. We see this most profoundly in a sweeping disregard for human life in its most vulnerable forms and stages. Abortion and assisted suicide are products of "Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit that has been given to us." Romans 5:5

hopelessness and despair. Yet even amid the increasing attacks on human life, we know that the "storms that buffet us will never prevail, for we are firmly anchored in the hope born of grace, which enables us to live in Christ and to overcome sin, fear and death."4

We have been entrusted with a message of hope for the woman who finds herself unexpectedly pregnant or for the man diagnosed with a terminal illness. At these challenging moments, we must bring God's presence, witnessing to His love, and inspiring a renewal of hope in those whose hearts are burdened. For "hope is born of love and based on the love springing from the pierced heart of Jesus upon the cross."5

Having been "buried with Christ in Baptism, we receive in his resurrection the gift of a new life that breaks down the walls of death."6 Confident of God's presence within us, may we share the Gospel of Life with those most in need of hope, knowing that "the grace of God precedes and accompanies his people as they press forward firm in faith, active in charity and steadfast in hope."7

hen they arrived at the place which God had indicated to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to kill his son. But the angel of Yahweh called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham!' he said. 'Here I am,' he replied. DON'T FORGET
THE POOR

Saint Faustina Kowalska

FEAST DAY - OCTOBER 5

aint Faustina was born in 1905 into a poor Polish family and experienced a religious calling from a young age. She initially deferred pursuing a religious vocation to help her family with her earnings as a housekeeper. At age 19, after a vision of the suffering Jesus, she earnestly sought entrance into religious life. Initially turned away by many convents, she entered the order of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925. In April 1928, she took her first vows with her parents in attendance. St. Faustina served the Congregation as a cook, gardener, and porter. While living a simple religious life, she grew in great union with God, experiencing profound sufferings as well as consolations. She had many visions of Jesus and wrote a diary of her experiences. St. Faustina died from tuberculosis at the age of 33 in 1938.

In 1959, the Vatican suppressed the Divine Mercy devotion. But in 1978, the Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith lifted the suppression after new original documents were examined and texts were retranslated. Then Cardinal Karol Wojtyla strongly promoted the message of Divine Mercy. Later, as Pope John Paul II, he canonized St.

Faustina, in April 2000, and designated the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. Because of her work fostering devotion to Divine Mercy, St. Faustina is known as the "apostle of Divine Mercy."

Jesus appeared to her many times and spoke of his great and unfathomable mercy to those who would trust in him. Jesus told St. Faustina that he wanted the Sunday after Easter to be celebrated as a "Feast of Mercy," as a refuge for all souls, especially poor sinners. On Divine Mercy Sunday, celebrated the weekend after Easter, the Gospel tells the story of when Jesus appeared in a locked room where the disciples were hiding.


In today's second reading, St. Paul reminds us of our responsibility as disciples saying, "Stir into a flame the gift of God that you have..." We may feel inadequate or ill equipped to speak to another person about our faith or its importance in our lives, but St. Paul encourages us further with these words, "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love..." Even when Jesus' own disciples were worried about their ability to carry out his mission, they turned to him asking for an increase of faith. How about us? Are we willing to share with courage the importance of our relationship with God?
